Returns can be placed in our outdoor book drop. (Returned items will be quarantined for 4 days & will still appear on your account. You will not be charged any fines for this period.)

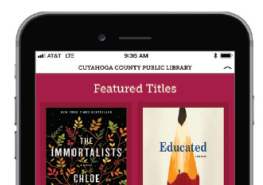

Lou uses authentic photos, timelines and primary source documents to bring Luigi's story to life. The presentation culminates with designer Gutzon Borglum's praise of Luigi, the 25 year struggle to get him recognized and the CBS SUNDAY MORNING tribute where a plaque at Mount Rushmore is finally unveiled!
