


MARION LOUISE SALVATI

No name in the 1959 edition of The Arlion twines round the affections or stirs the emotions as does the name of Marion Salvati.

Born in Arnold on July 15, 1942, Marion was the second daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Salvati. For 12 years her life was as uneventful or eventful as the life of any child. However, the days, weeks, months, and years following her entrance into seventh grade painted a far different picture. Marion had developed cancer. Its slow but relentless march through her body met strong opposition in her fearless, fighting spirit. Some times its ugly progress seemed almost defeated; other times its presence was more than defeating until on January 29, 1959 Marion's frail frame, wearied by its long struggle succumbed to the blast of the "enemy."


