



BACKGROUND OF OUR NEW SCHOOL


On October 2, 1961, after five years of construction, students began their classes in our new Senior High School. The \$1,649,350 structure was built on the Cramer plot of land in Buffalo Township due to the fact that 50% of the students come from Buffalo Township and a large enough area was not available in Freeport.

Two additions were made in 1946 and again in 1949 to the 38 year old building in Freeport. Because of the overcrowded conditions, the possibility of a new building was brought up but the State School Authority did not approve the plan. In 1955, the School Board decided that a new senior high building was the only answer. Thus, for four years, the older building had been operating on split sessions. This year, more varied clubs and subjects are available for Senior High students.




Early Stages of Construction.








DEDICATION
