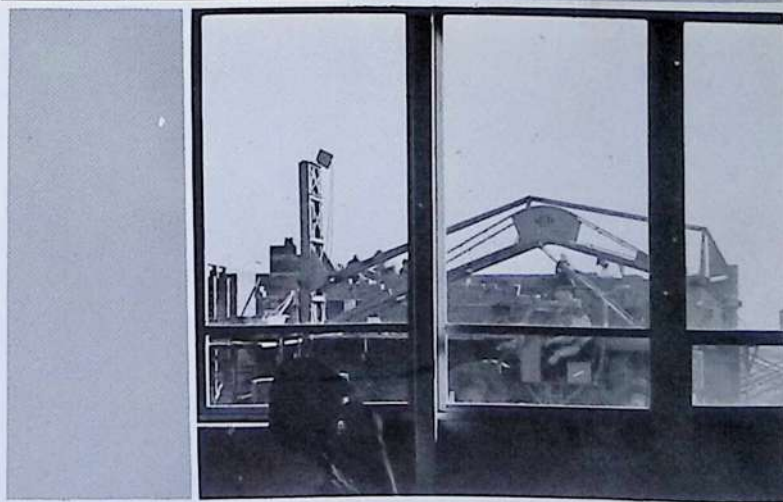

Principal's Message


By the time this edition of the Freeportian is published, the curtain of the 1967-68 school year will have been drawn.

My 1967-68 school year will long be remembered.

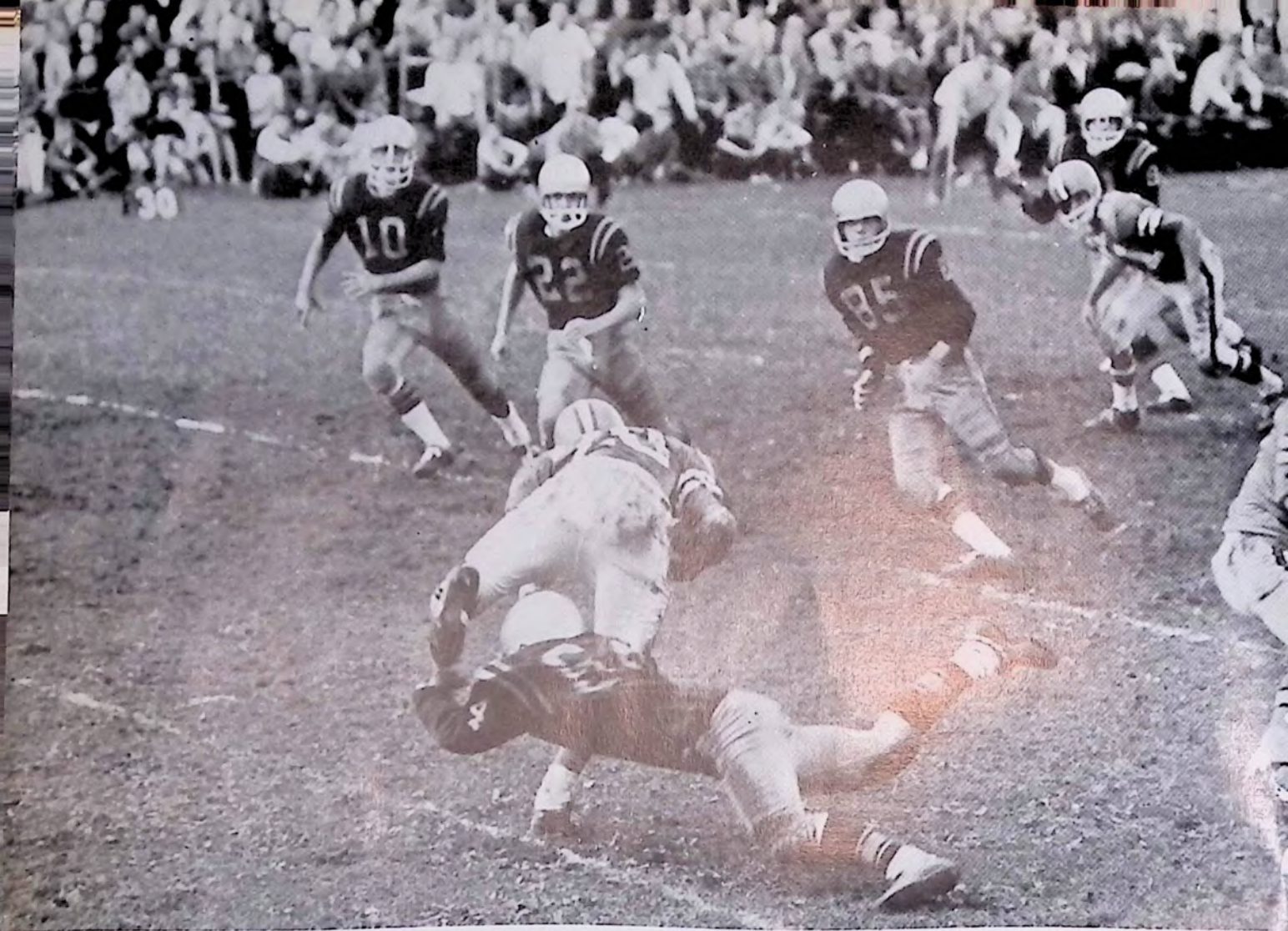

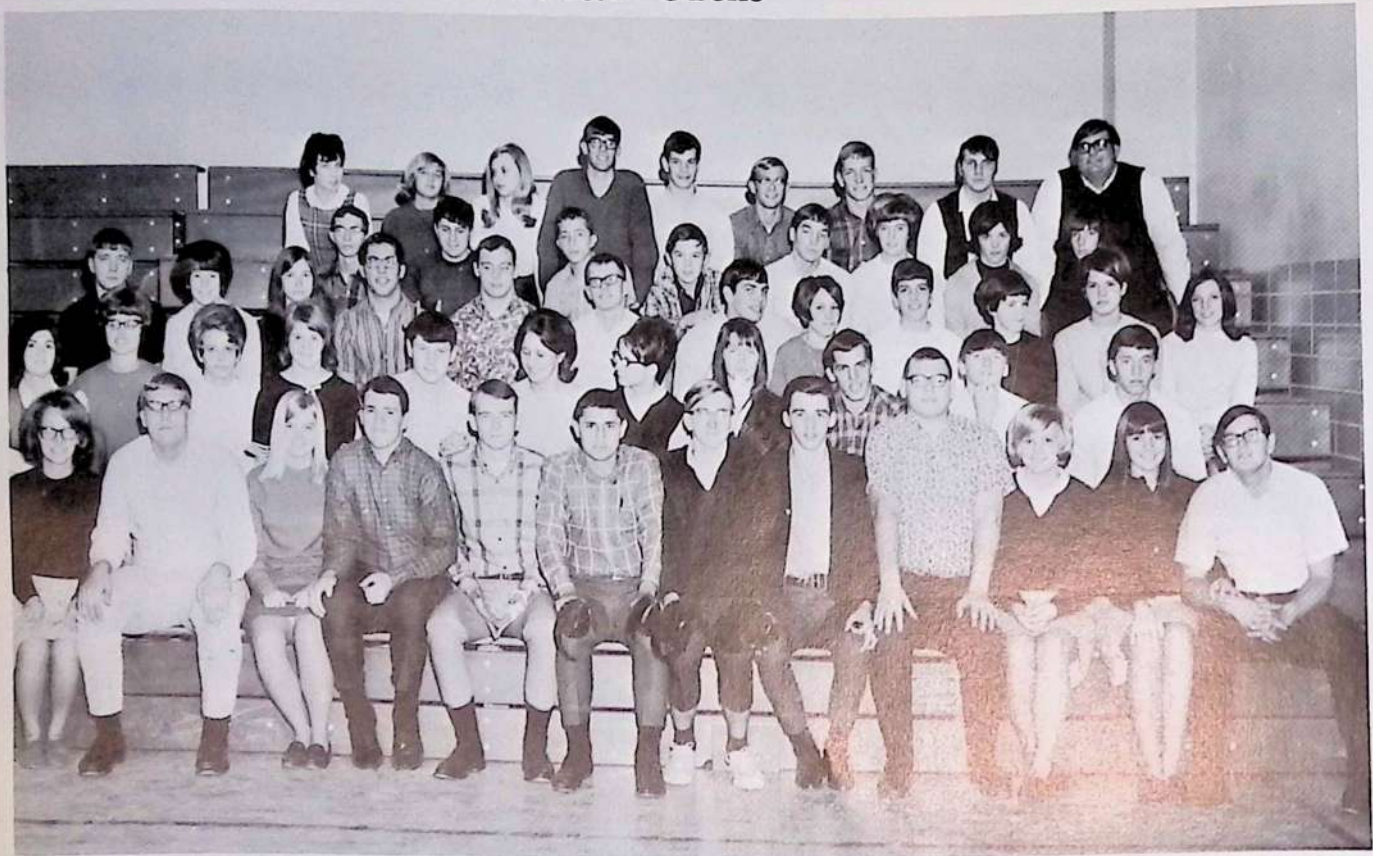
The purpose of this organization is one to Service to others who are not able to do so for themselves.
