
HOMECOMING QUEEN '72





FREEPORT vs. WASHINGTON


On November 17, 1972, at Norwin High School, the charges of Don Early from Free-port met the Little Presidents of Washington in the second round of playoff competition for the W.P.I.A.L. Class A championship. This was Freeport's first playoff game, having drawn a by in the initial round. Washington's strength came from their unusual single wing offensive formation, where Freeport's came from execution and a defense that wouldn't stop.


From the first, Frank Ballina was the offensive spark. The defense proved their worth, holding the usually explosive Washington offense scoreless throughout the game. The only sustained drive came in the third quarter, but the squad held and Freeport, under the quarterbacking of Dan Leri, went on to win by a lopsided score of 19-0.




FREEPORT vs. BEAVER

Each year the gridiron battles of the regular season culminate in the W.P.I.A.L. championship game. This year the combatants were Freeport and Beaver, two teams with perfect 10-0 records. The day of the tilt was November 30, 1972, at Pitt Stadium.

Beaver had first possession of the ball, but their drive sputtered and they were forced to punt. Freeport then drove steadily down the field, and a pass to wide receiver, Frank Trefelner, gave us what we thought was a touchdown, but it was called back because of a holding penalty. Freeport then punted and Beaver scored from the one yard line, some plays later. The conversion failed and the only other scoring of the half came when Leri connected on a pass to Dan Keener for six. Bill Johnson split the up-rights and Freeport went to the shower rooms with a 7-6 halftime lead.

The second half found Beaver going ahead 12-7, only to have Keener again score on a touchdown pass, making the score 14-12 after Johnson's boot for the extra point. Bever again came back and took a 20-14 lead late in the game. The game ended with that tally on the board and Freeport came home, defeated victims of a few bad breaks.
