The football team, unfortunately, lost to Apollo-Ridge 3-0 after playing tough defense all night.

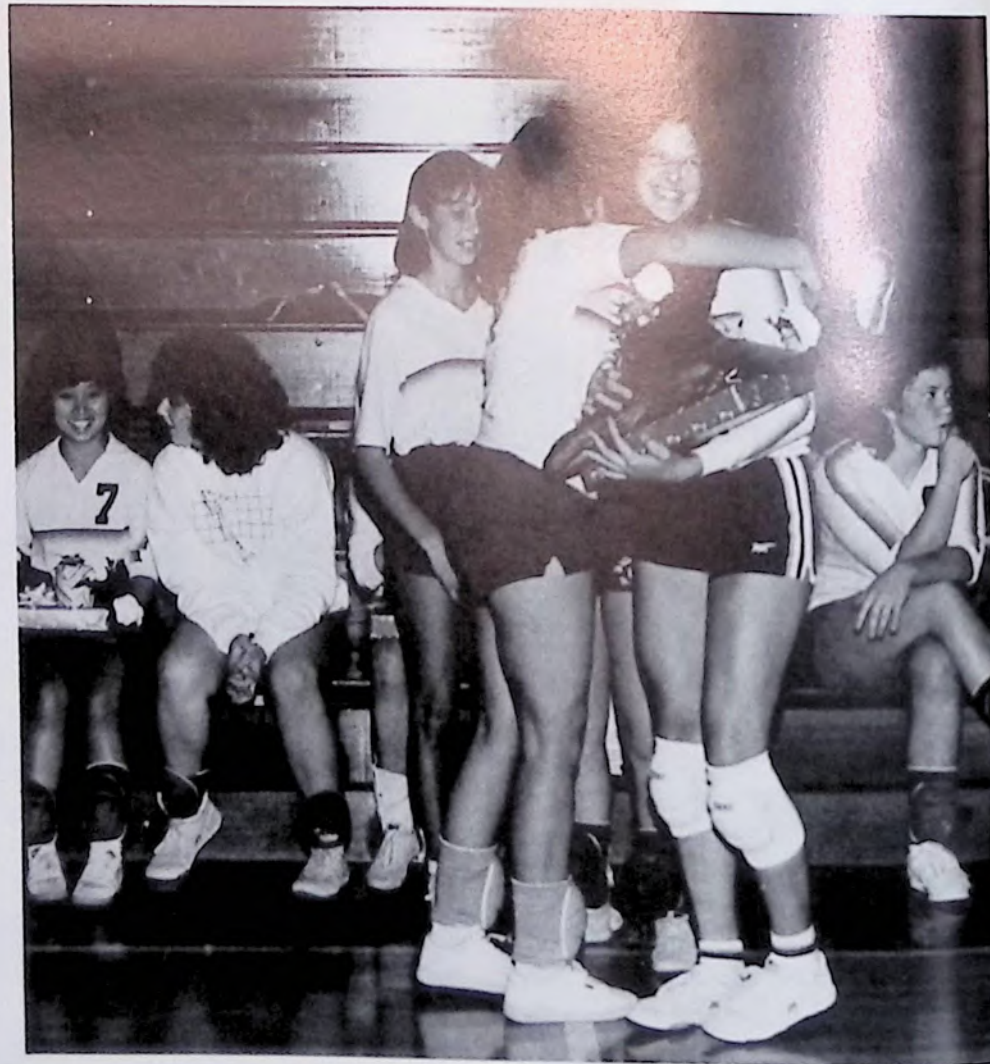

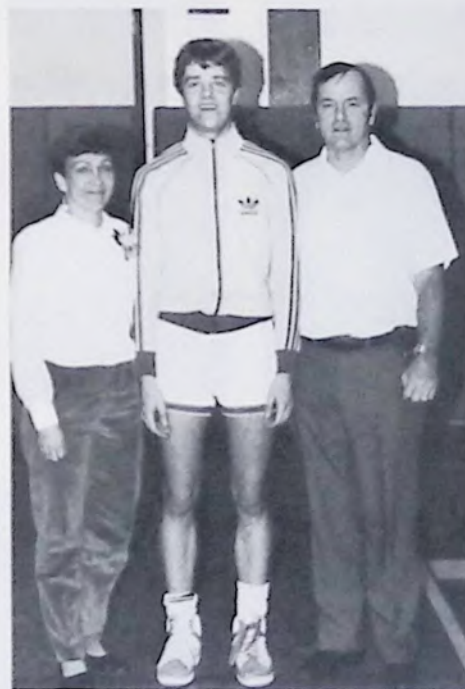

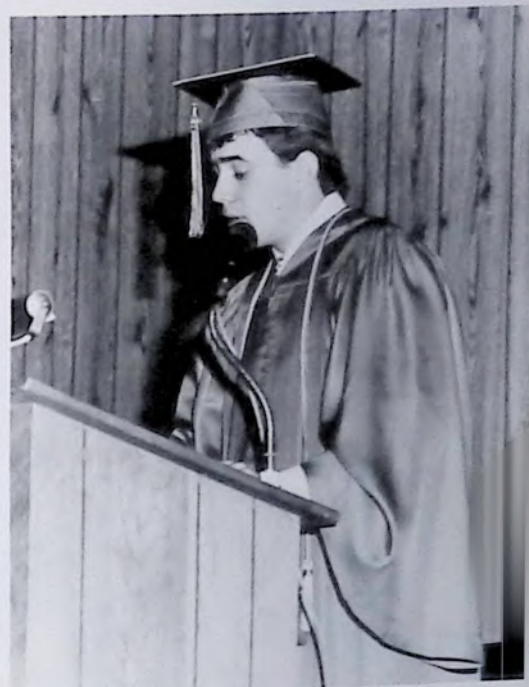
After the chorus sang "Maybe Someday" Mr. Gray, High School Principal, certified that the members of the class of

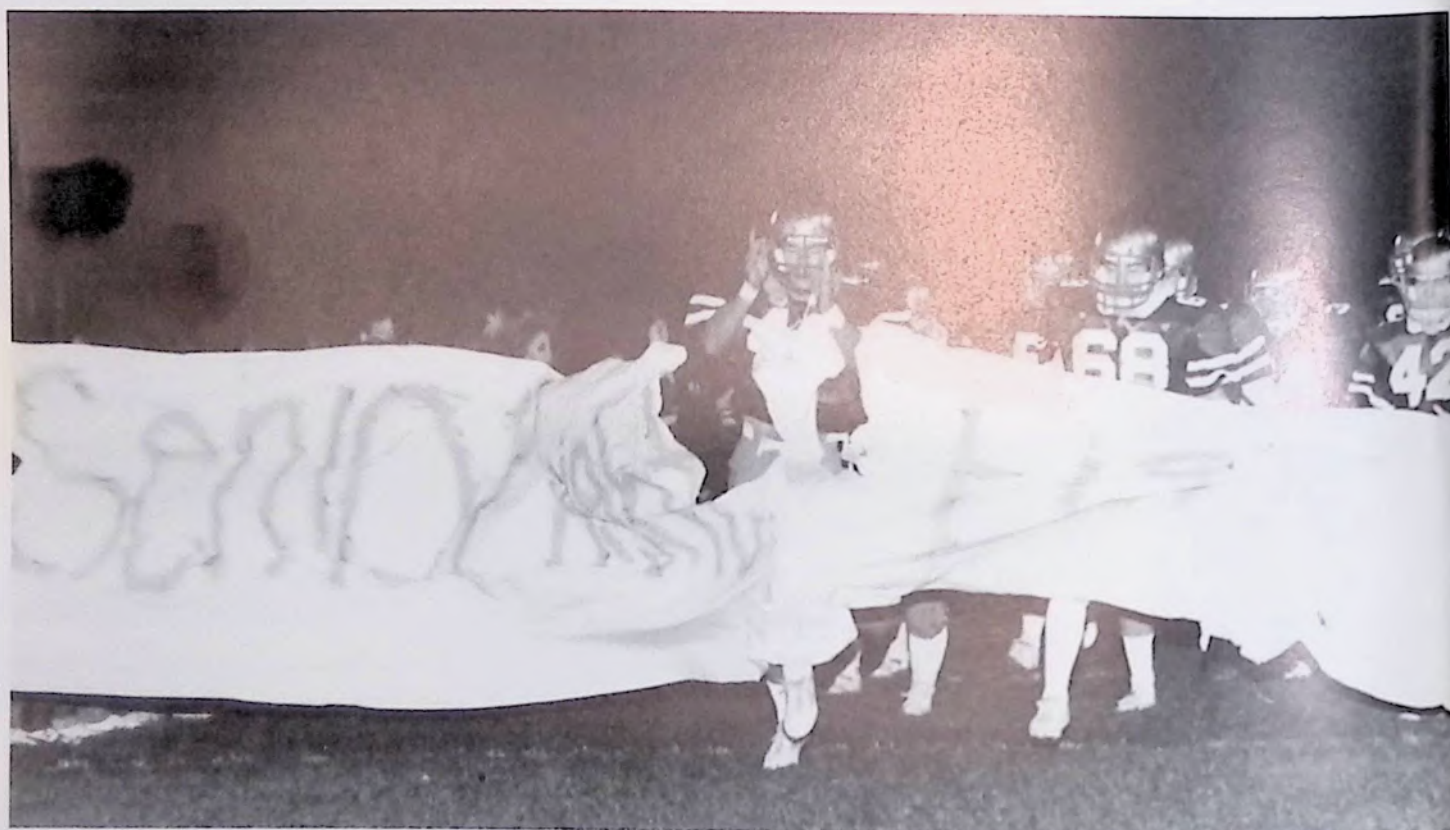

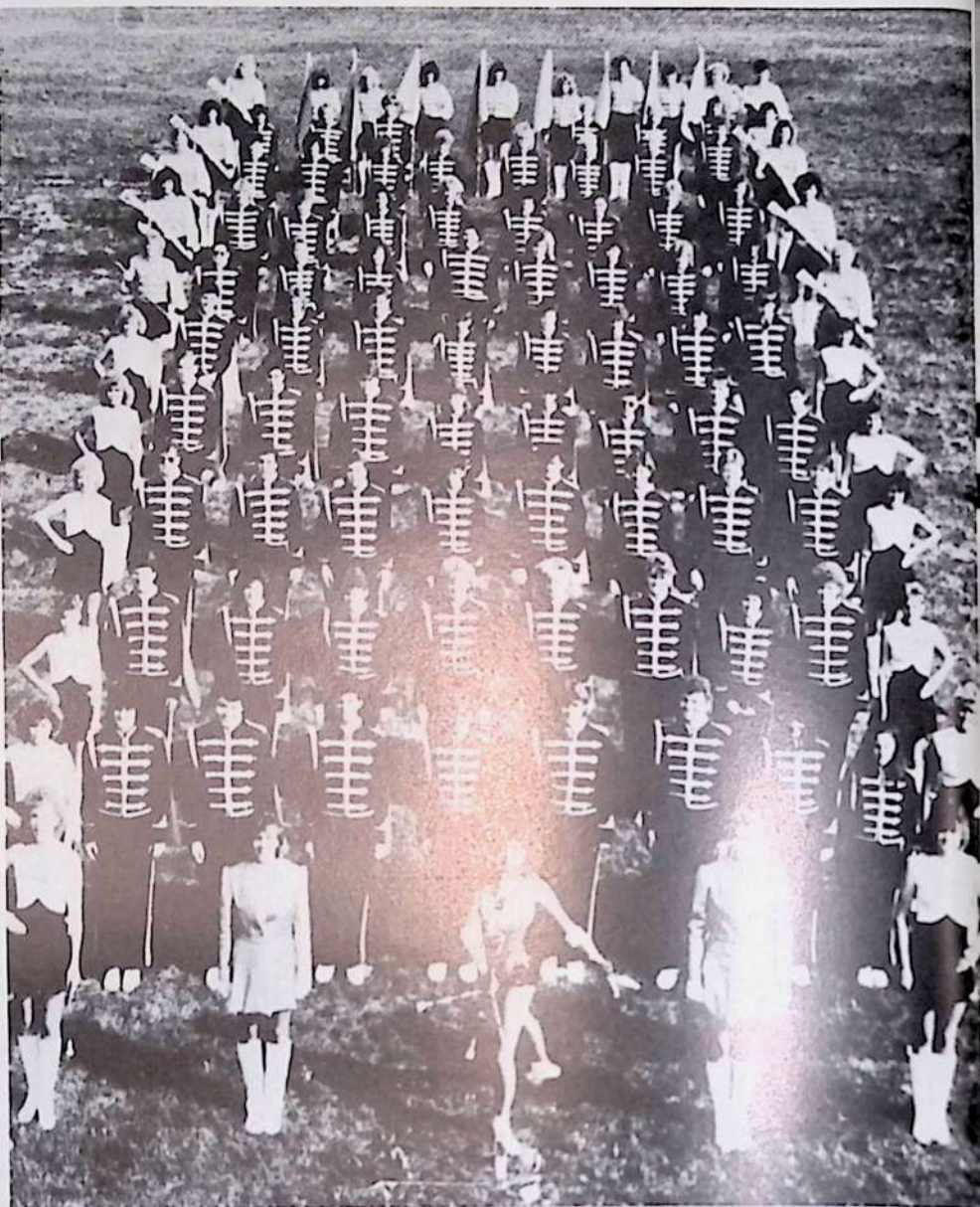
In March 1987, the band went to Florida for their annual trip. They raised money for the trip through various fund raisers.
