








SENIORS








Our Senior Year Memories

































Following the Alma Mater and the benediction by Rev. Saxman, the class of 1987 marched out of Laube Hall and into the real world.











The junior varsity captained by Jill Brestenky, Lisa Brestensky, and Michele Heinrich, completed the season with a record of 12-8 and third place in section.
















Inexperienced Team Improves




Christy Receives All-State, All-America Honors



Mike Elphinstone Boy Of The Year




It is the job of the advisor and the editor-in-chief to coordinate the staffs and create continuity throughout the book.




Administration
