


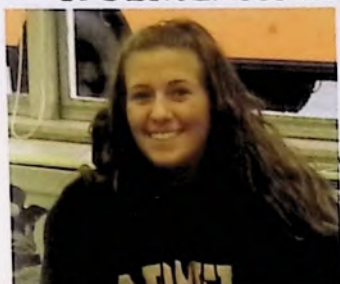

Once the high school puzzle is completed, you come away having had many life changing experiences.

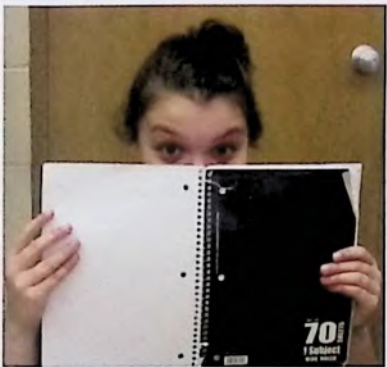
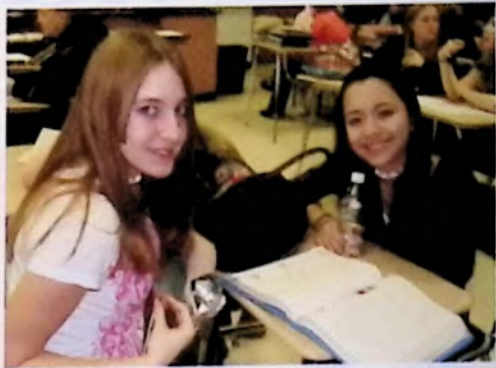

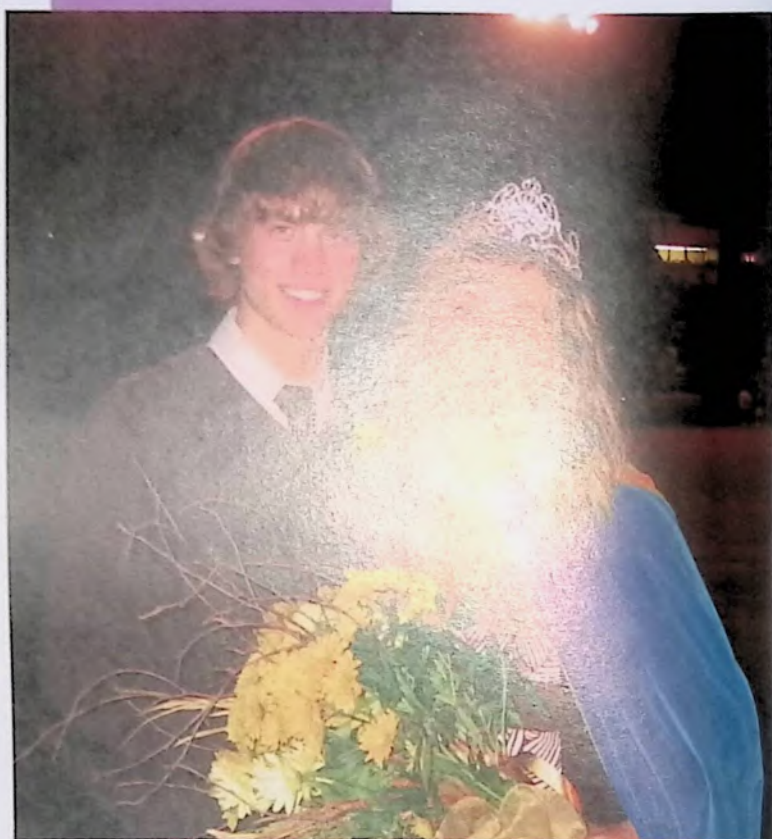
homecoming

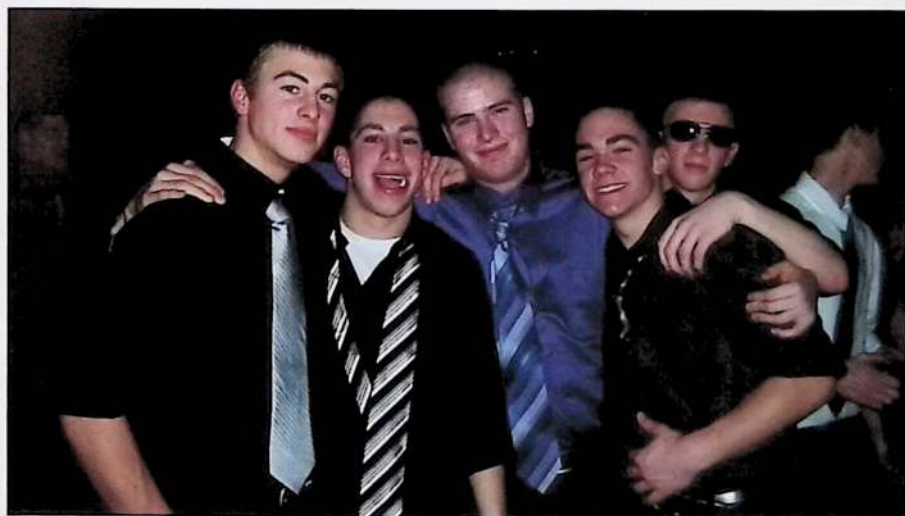

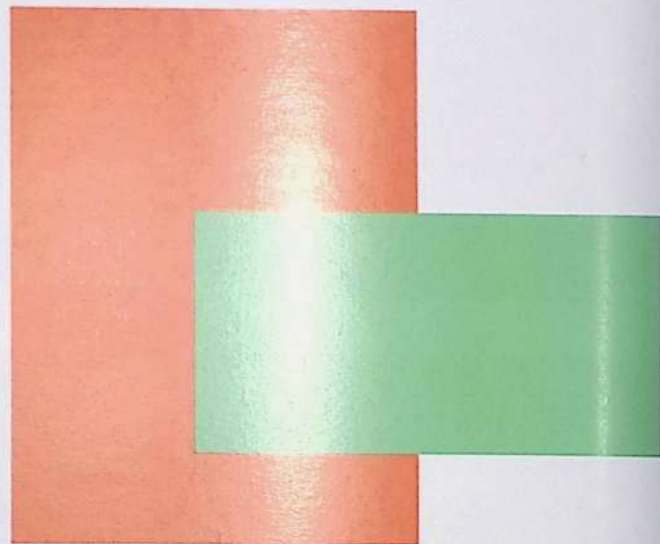

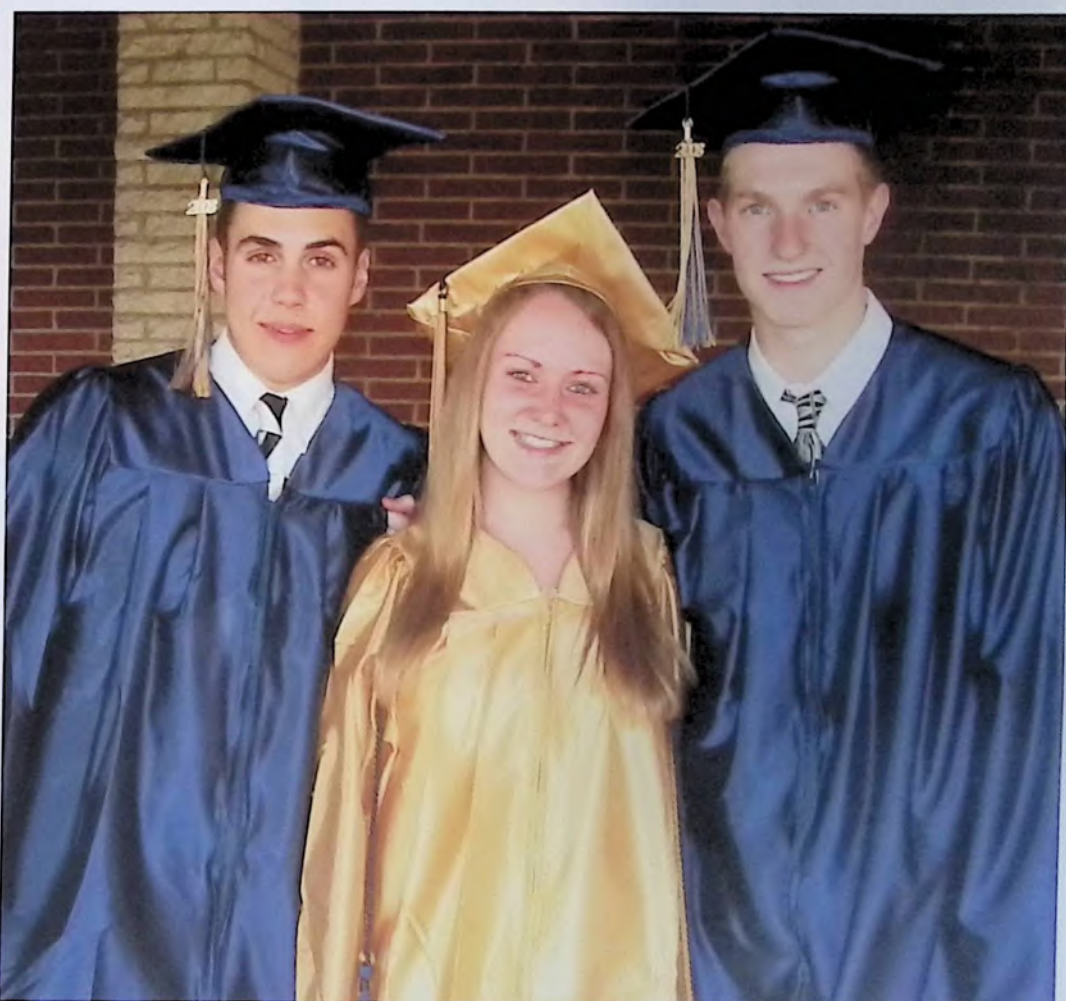

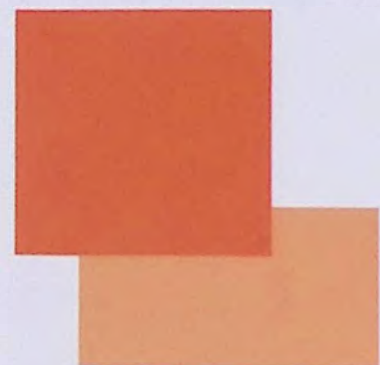

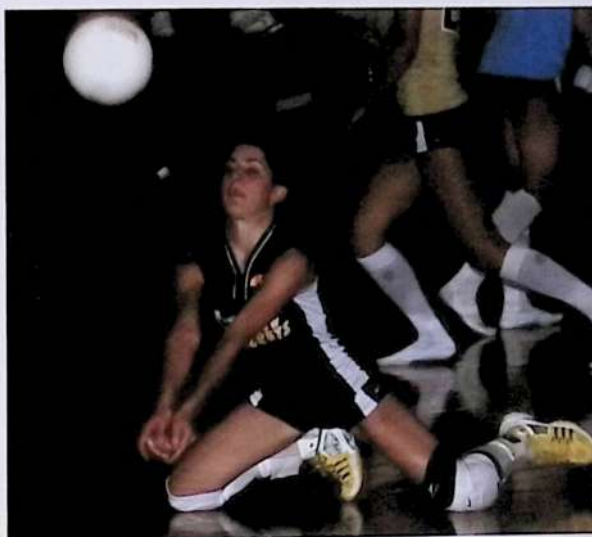

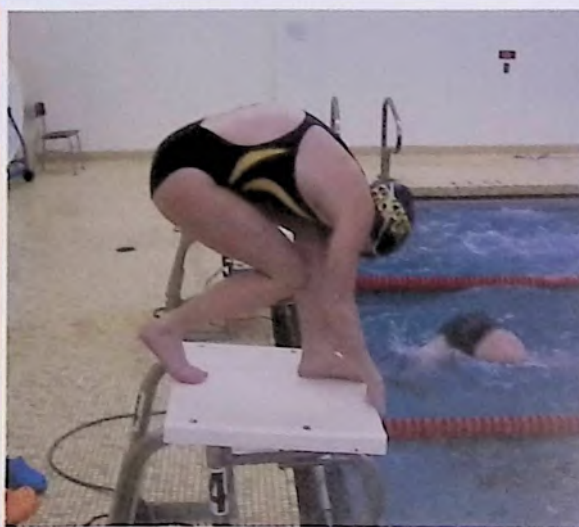

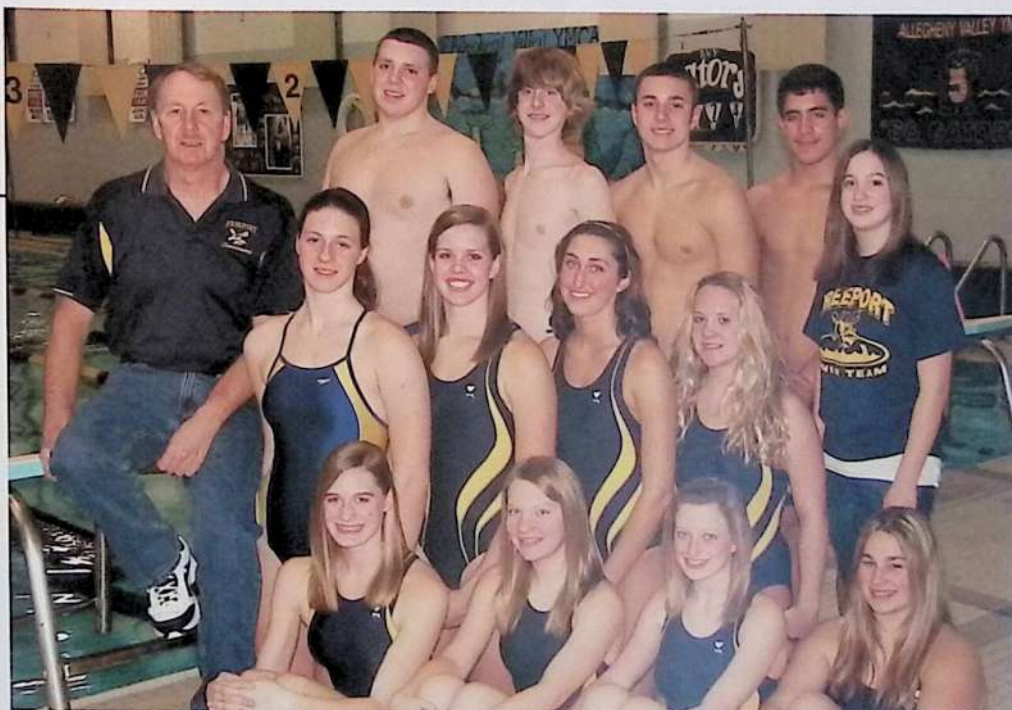

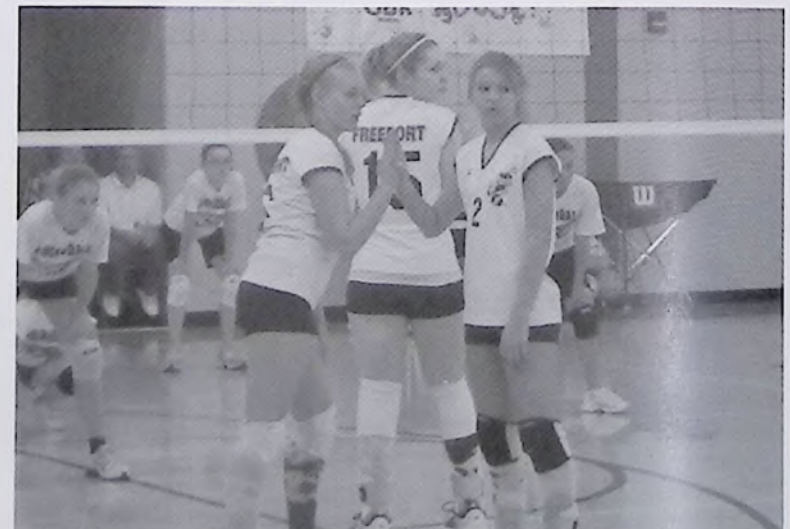
