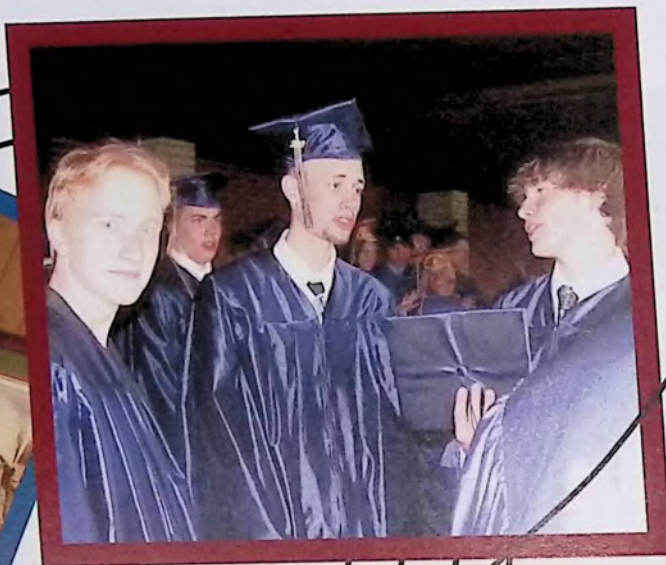

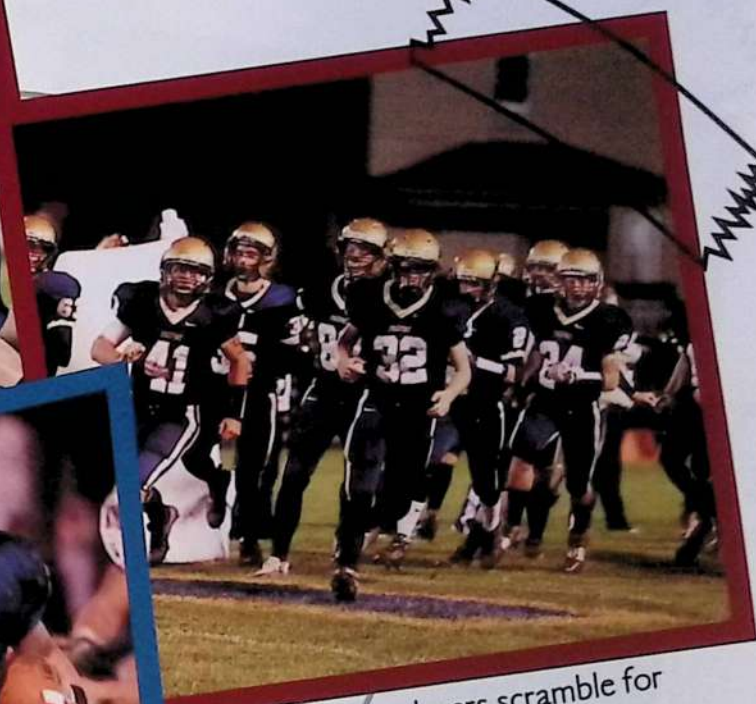

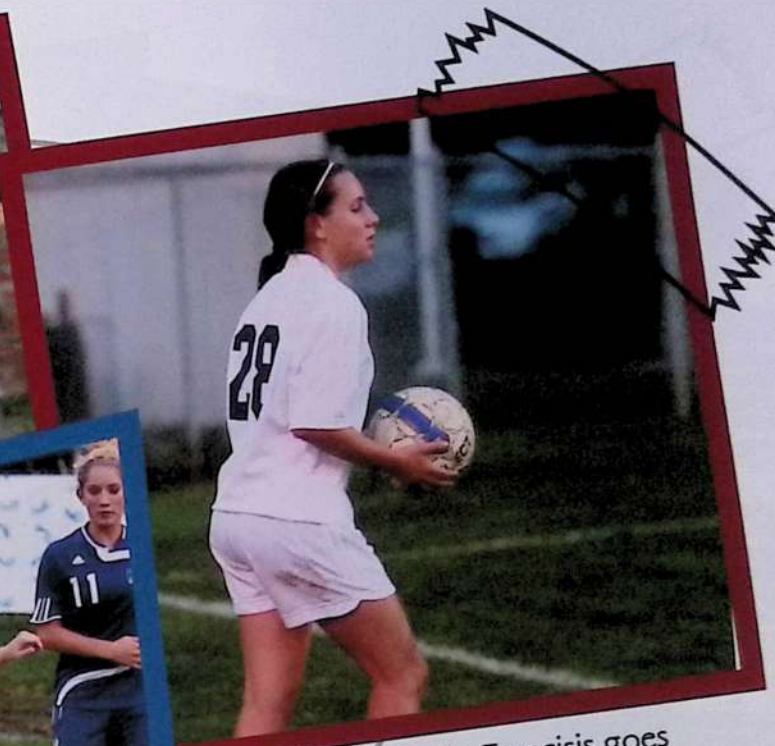

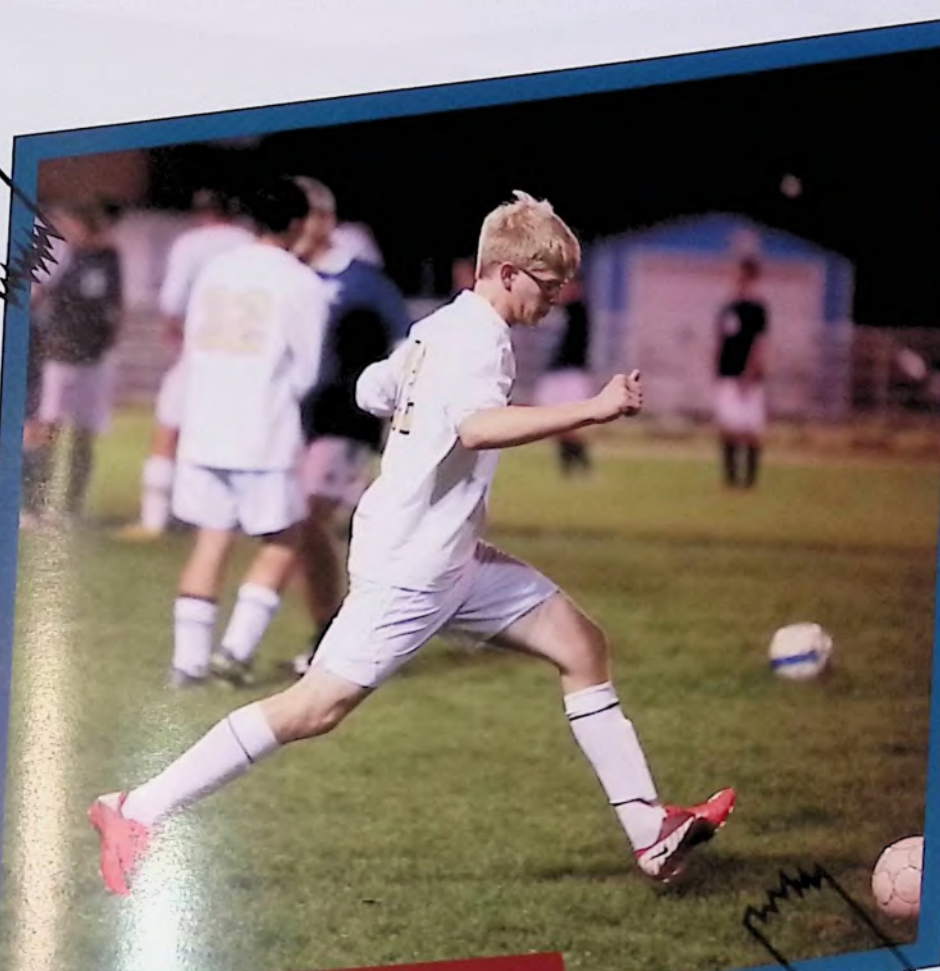

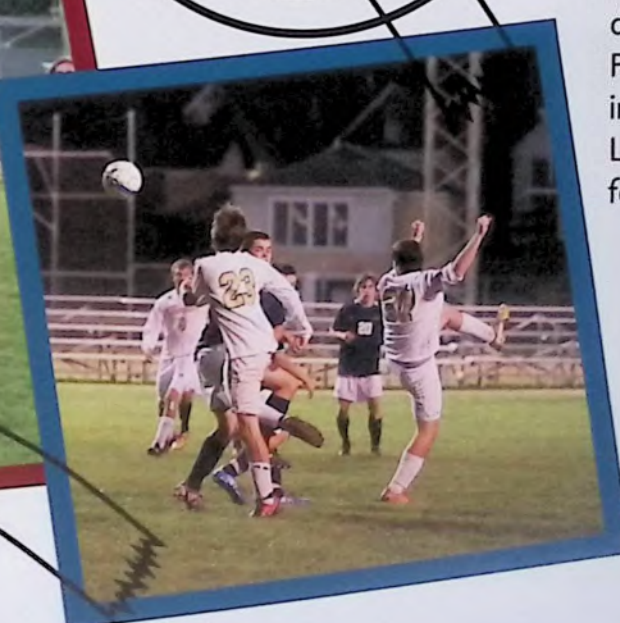

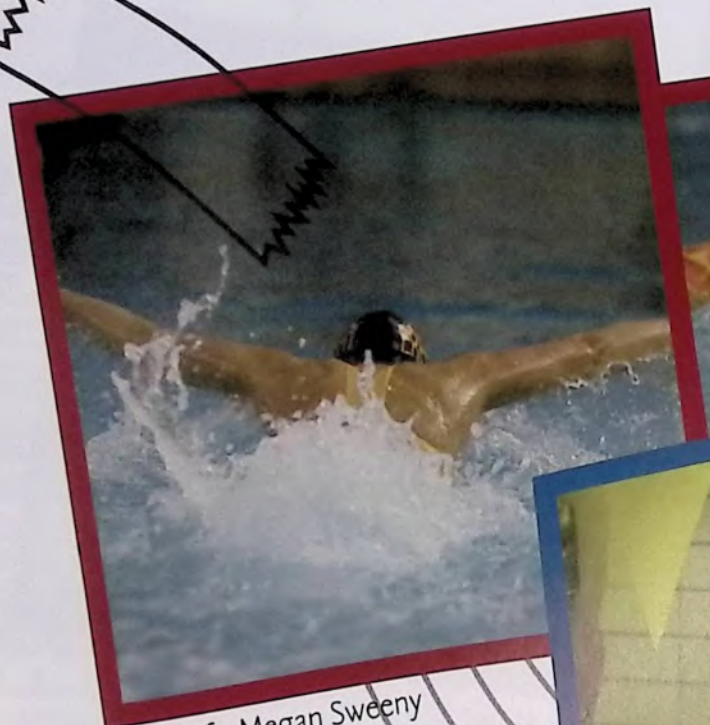

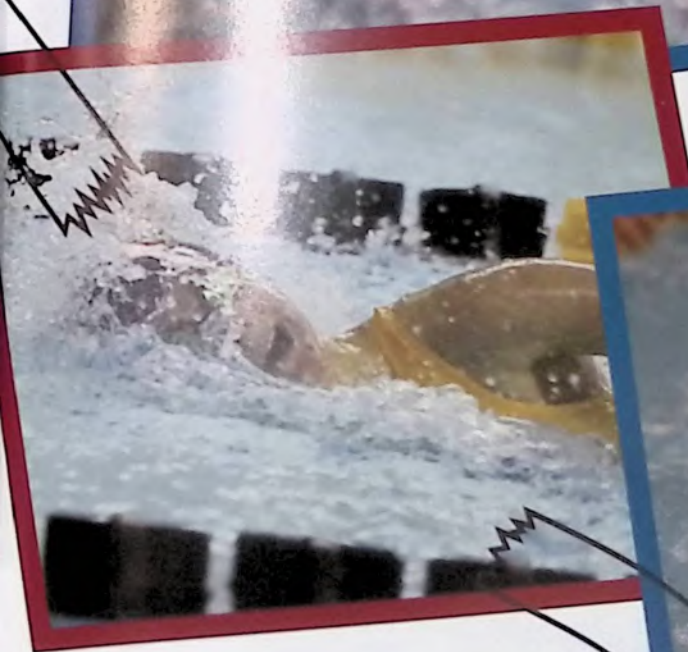

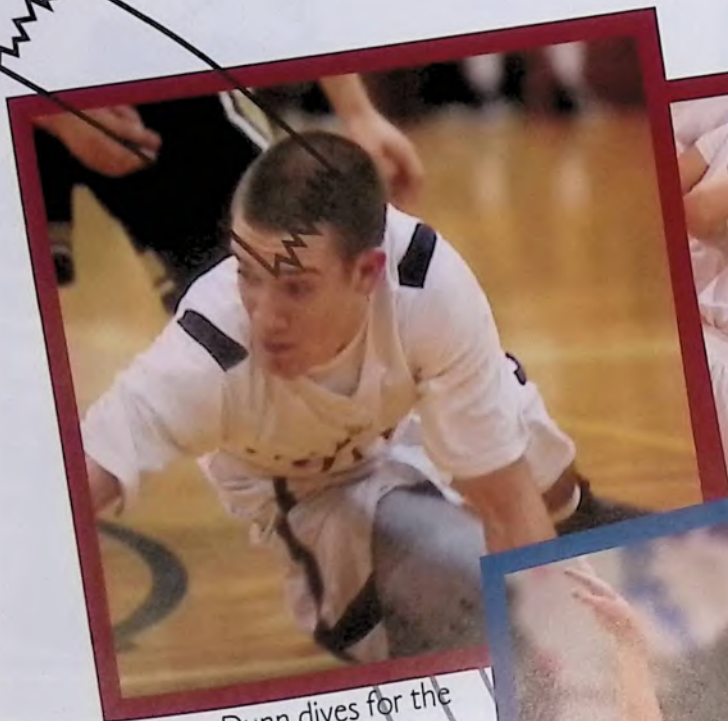

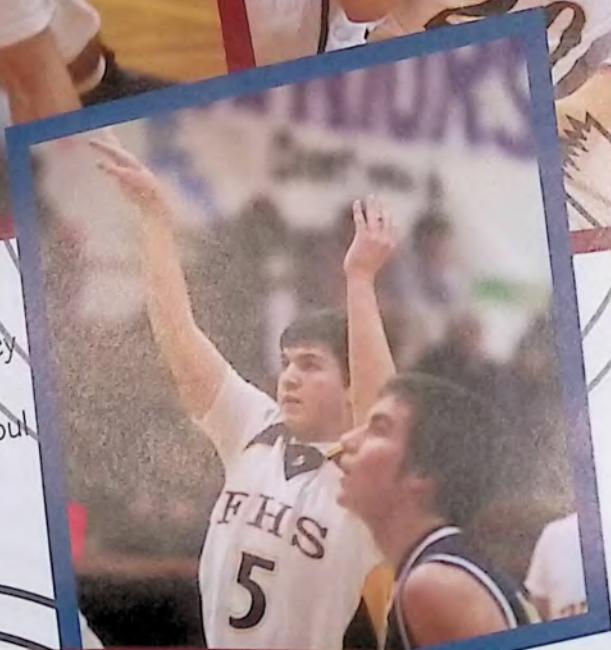

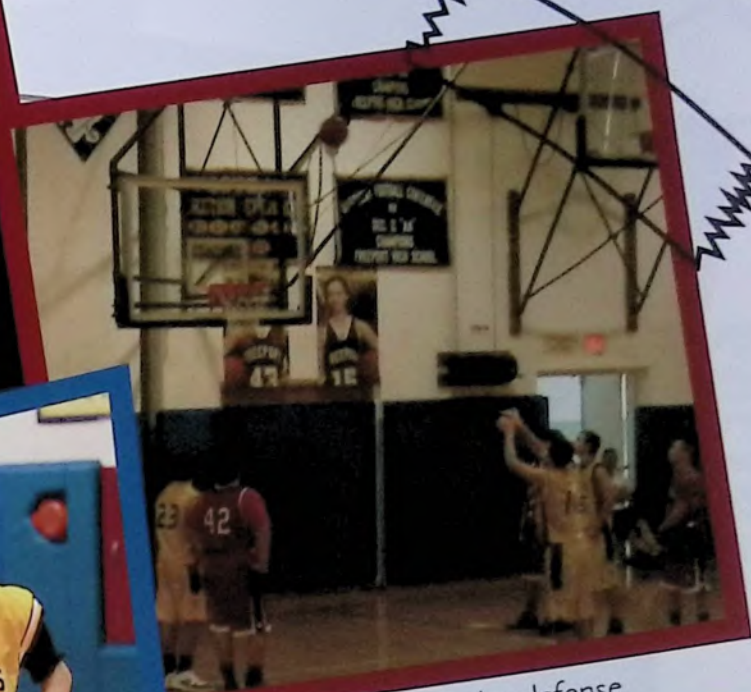

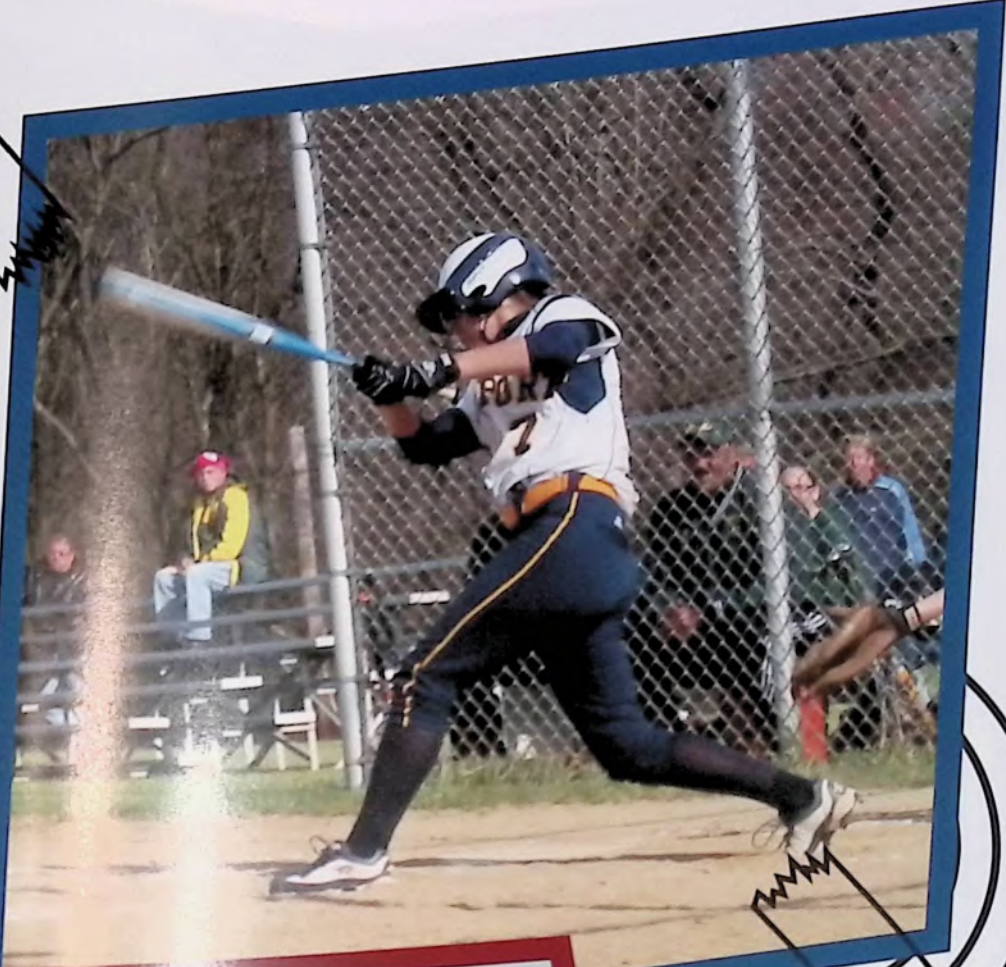

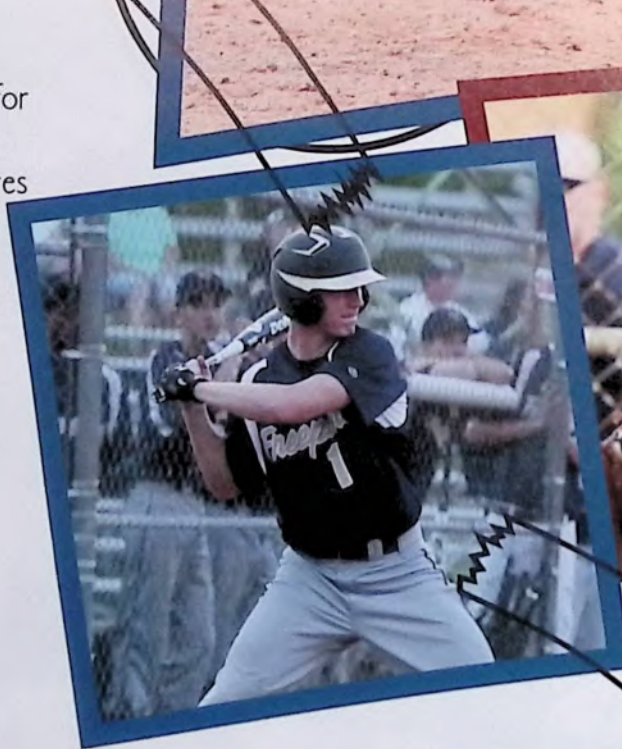

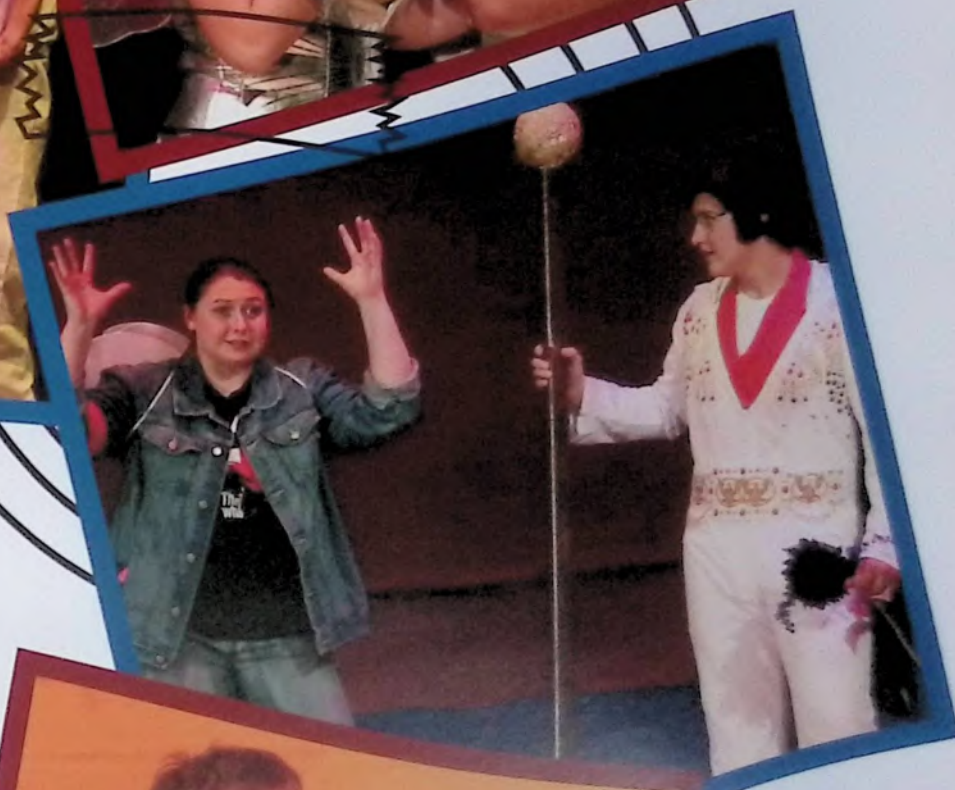


A MIDSUMMER'S NIGHT TALE

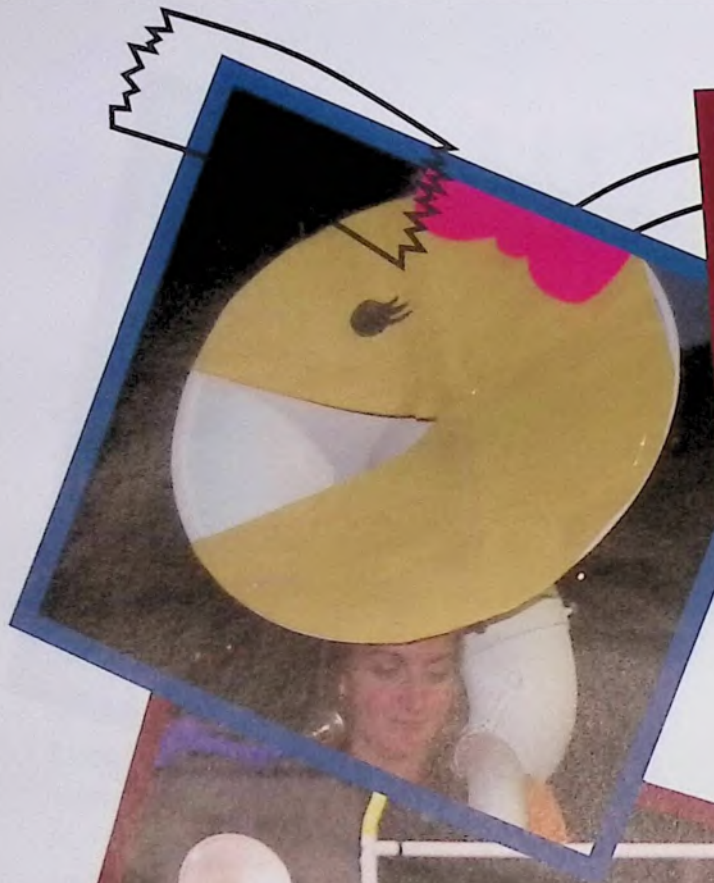

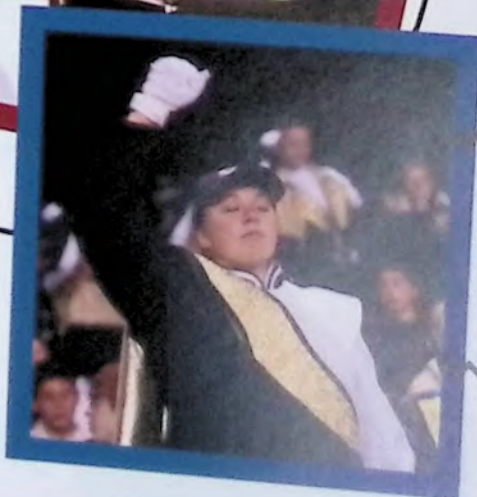

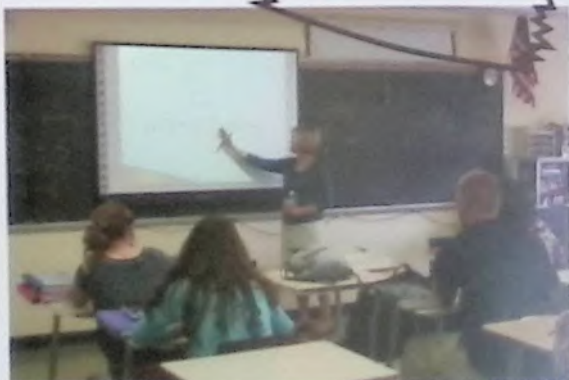
