MR. FLETCHER is the head football coach. He is well known in this area for his ability to produce winning teams, for he has two W.P.I.A.L. championships to his credit.

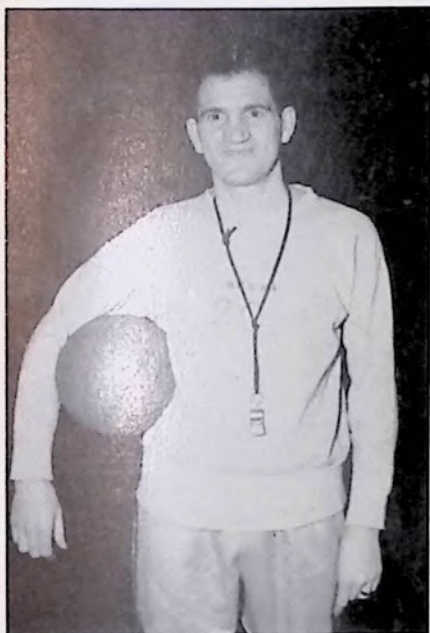


Basketball Coach
