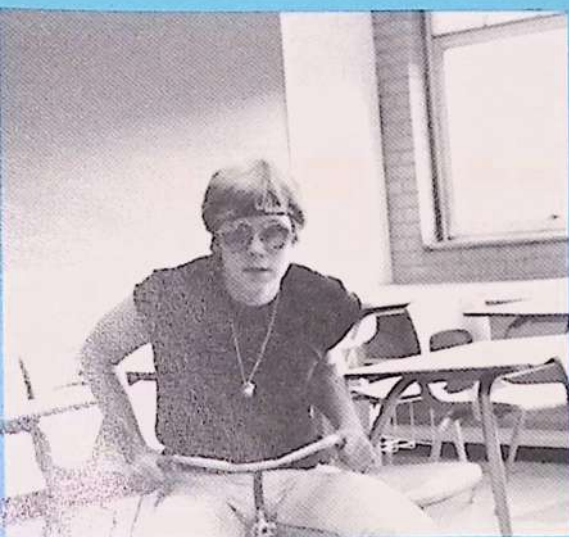

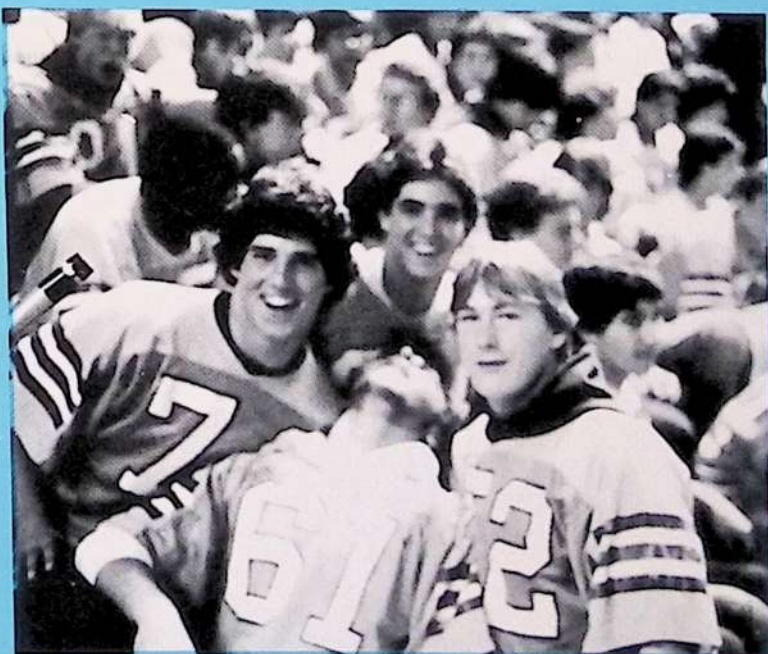


**"Memories fade . . ."**

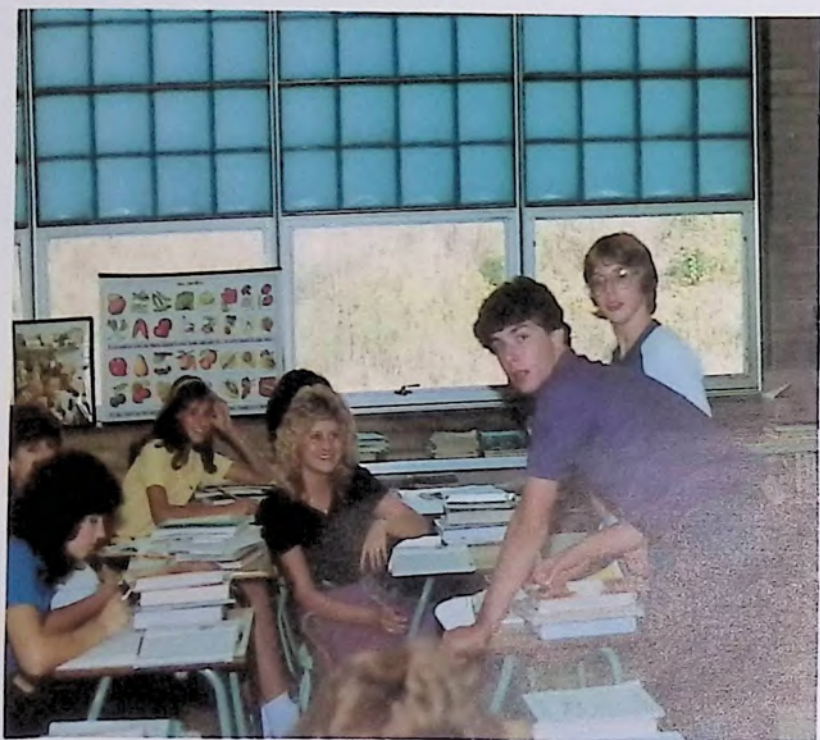
