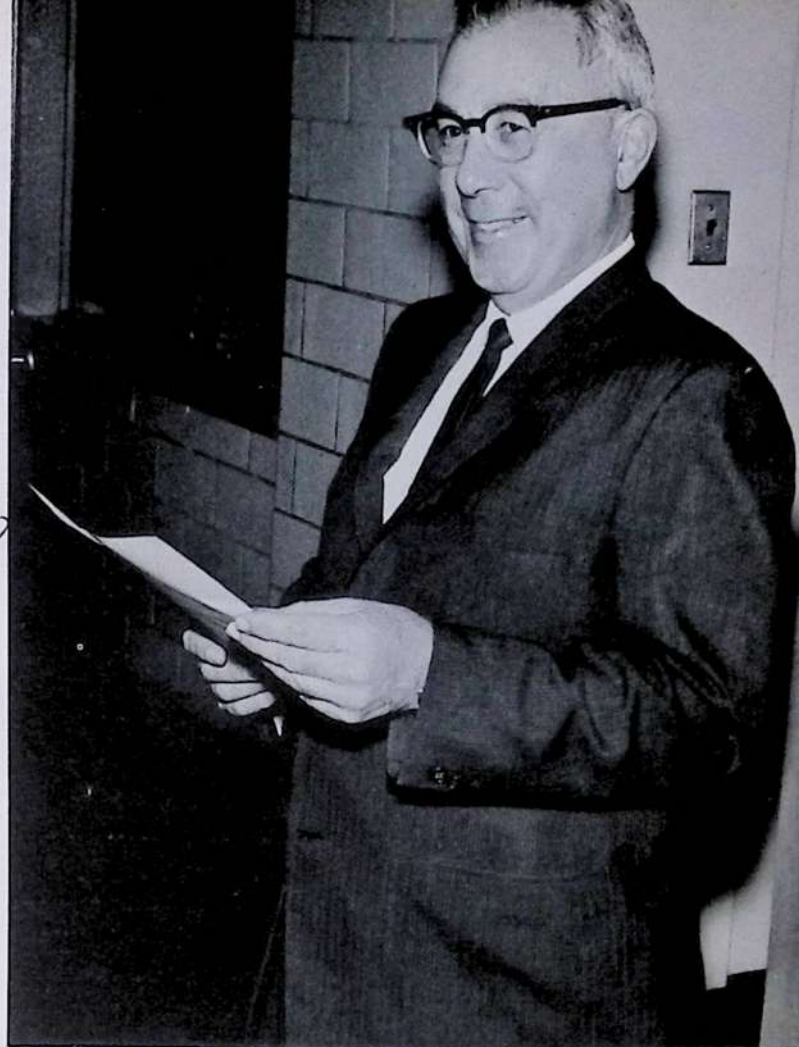
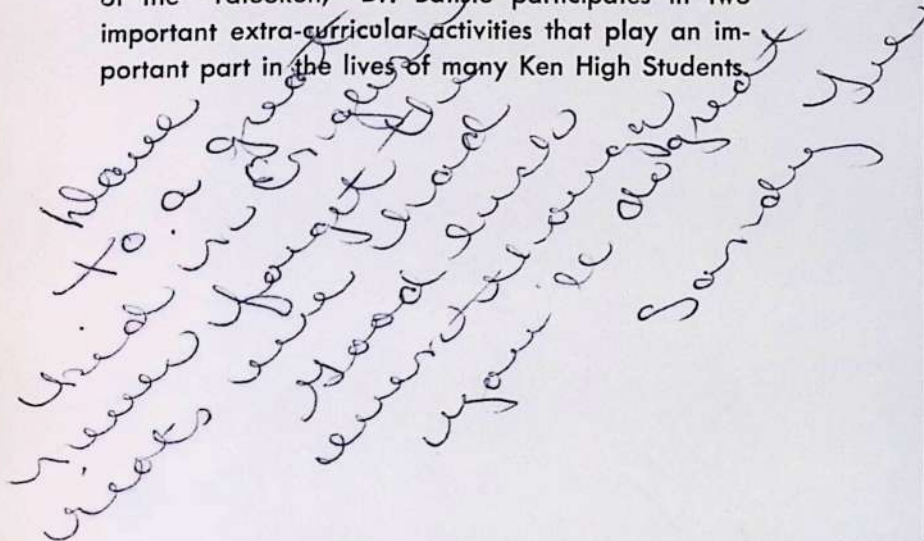
FRANK G. OLIVER, *Principal*

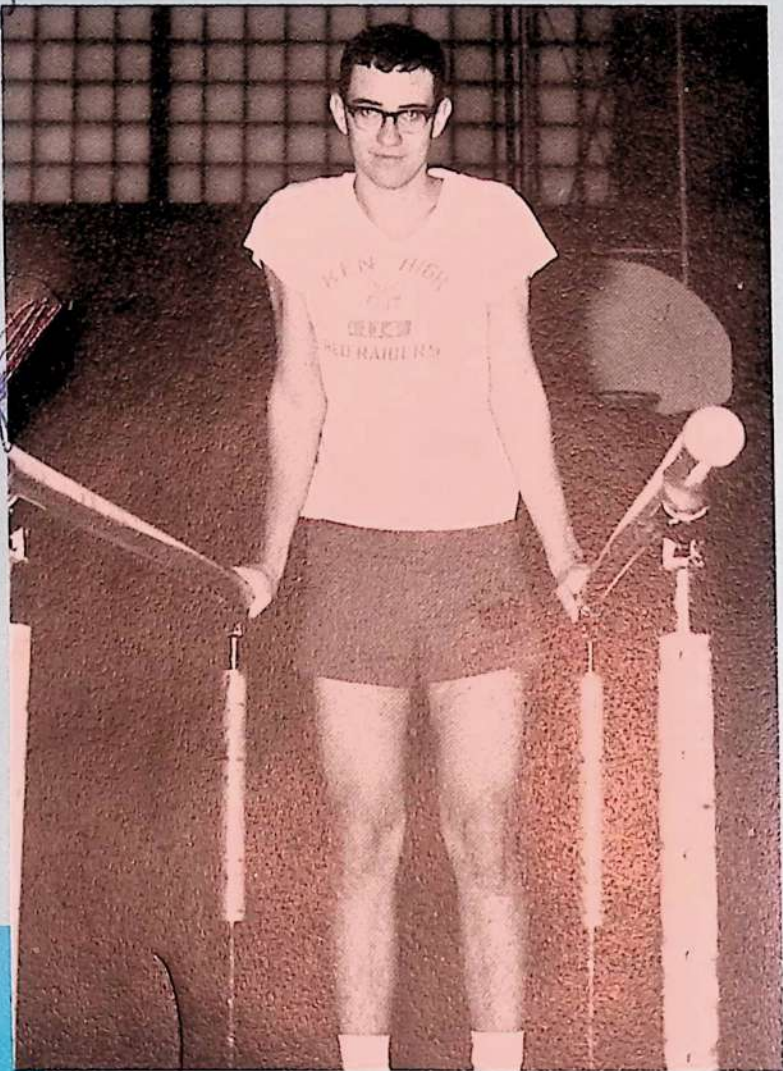
Maintenance Staff

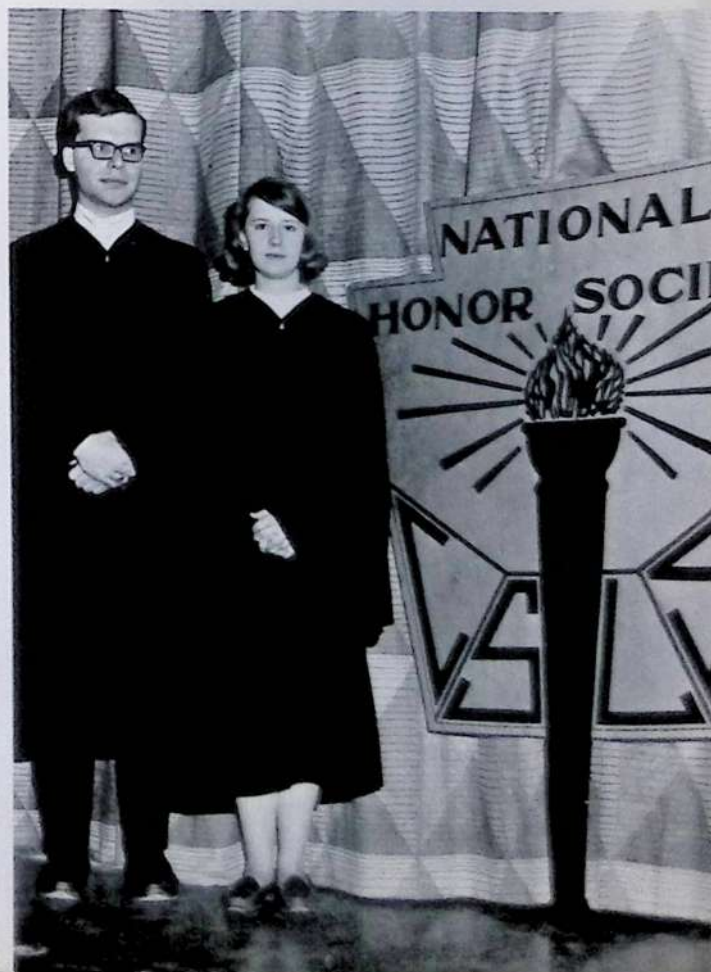
National Honor Society

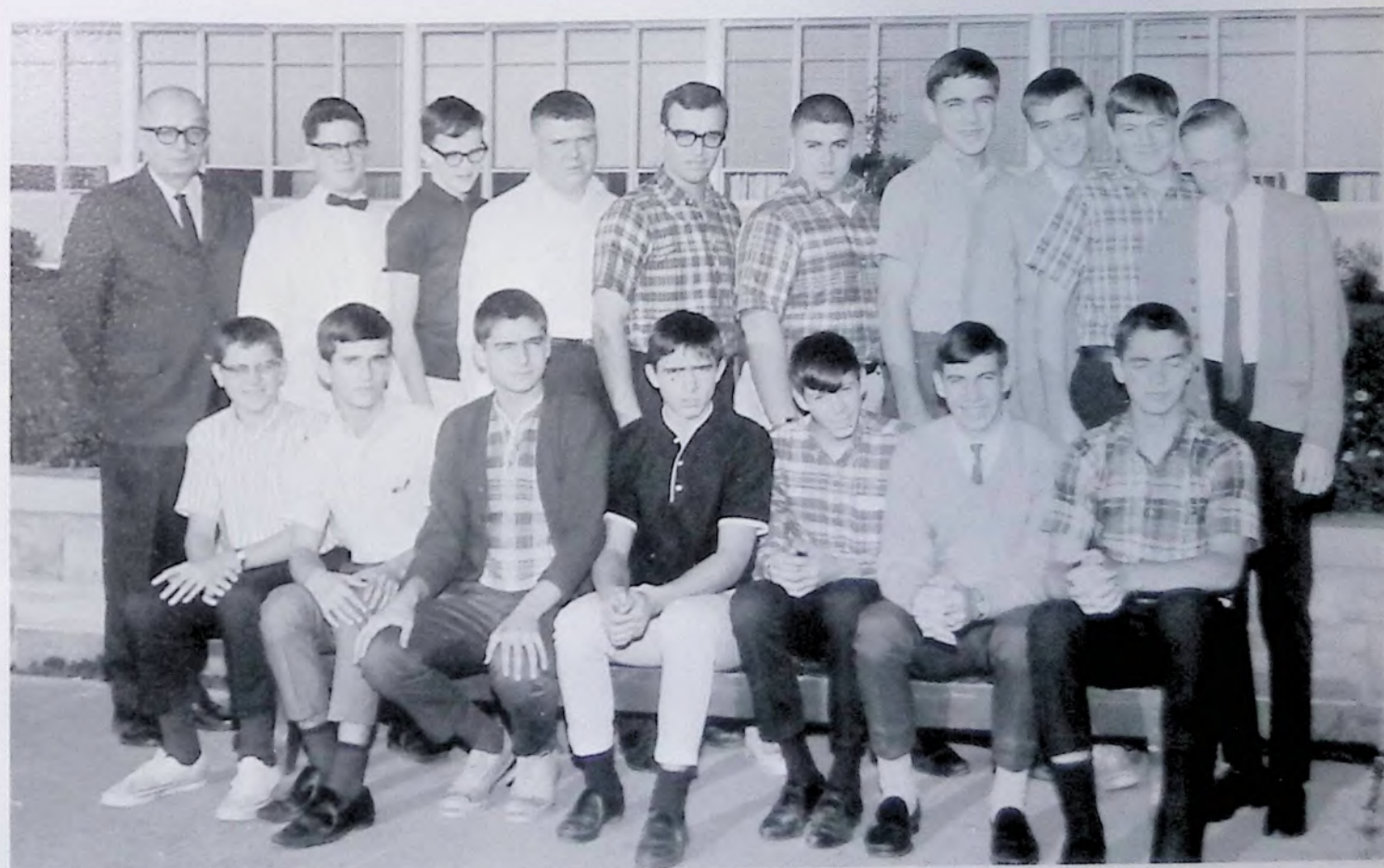

Art Service Club

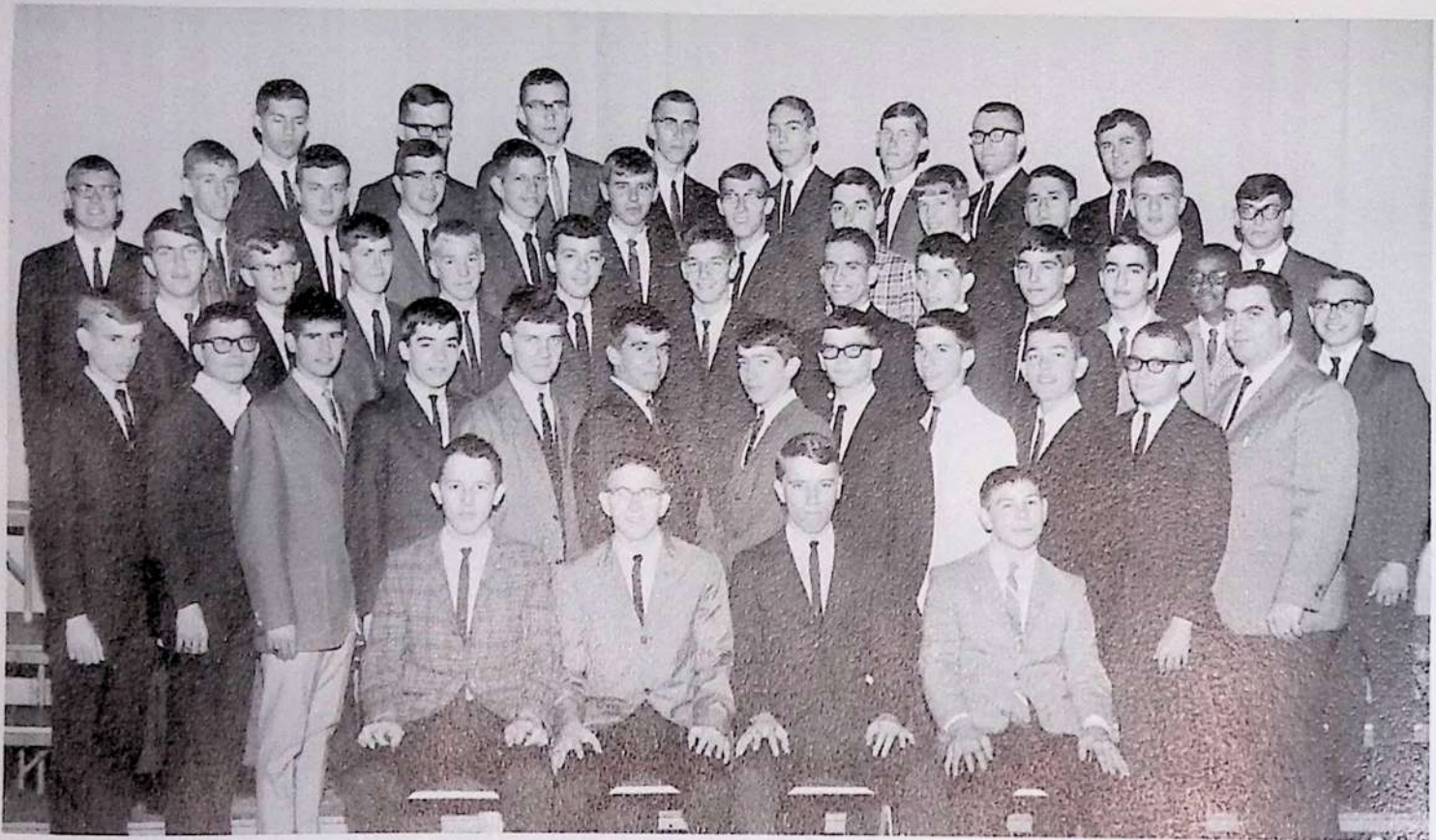

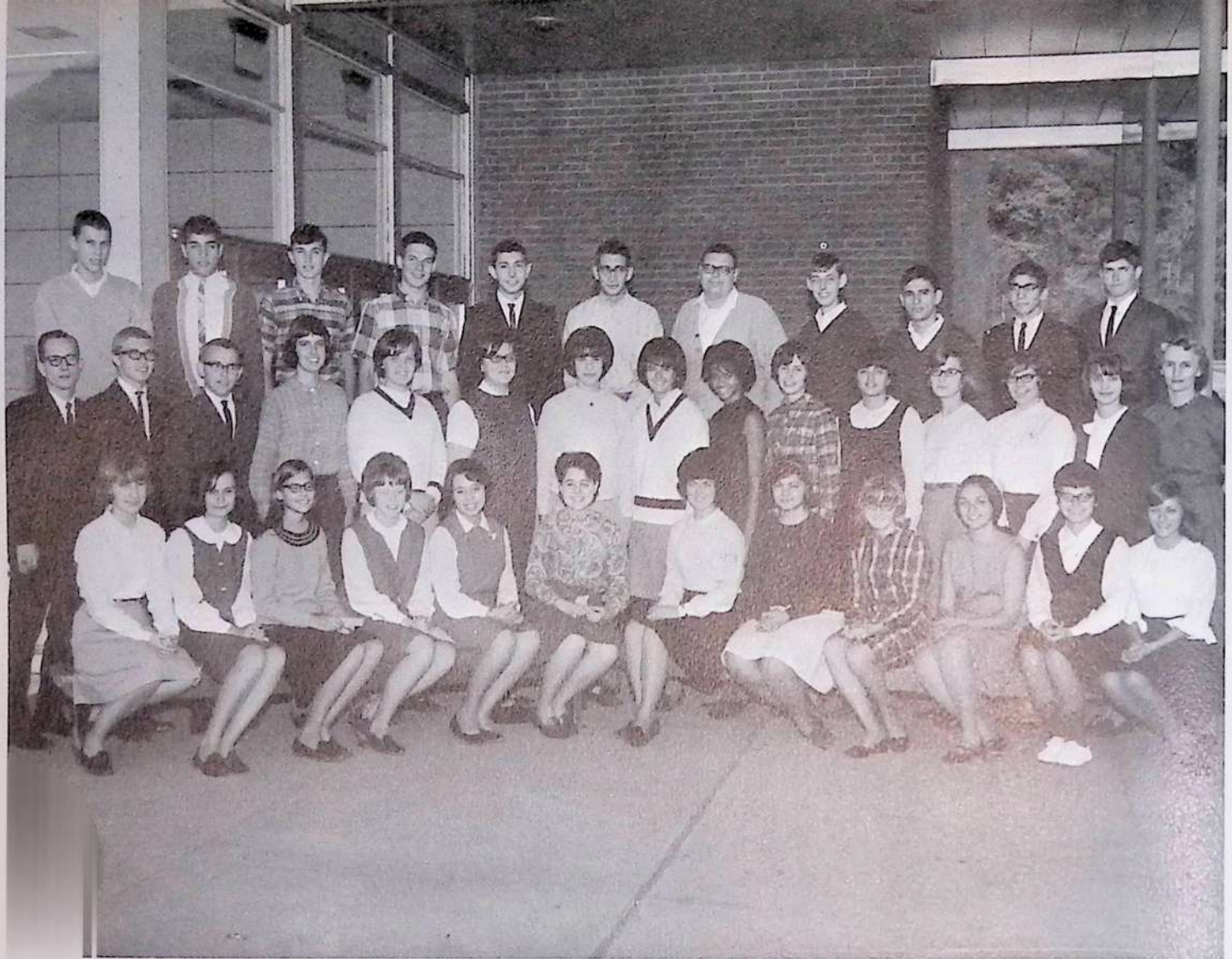

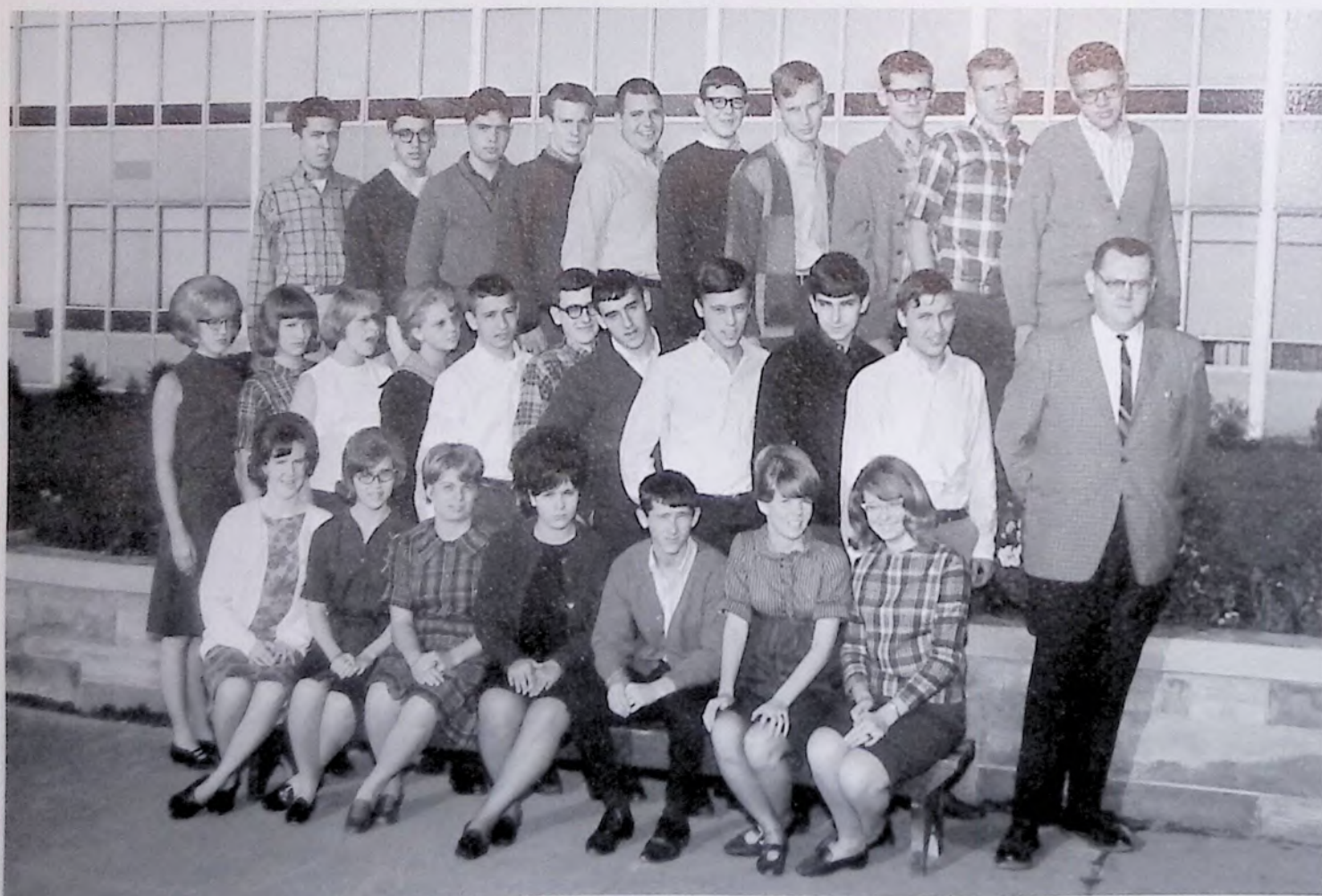

Distributive Education Club

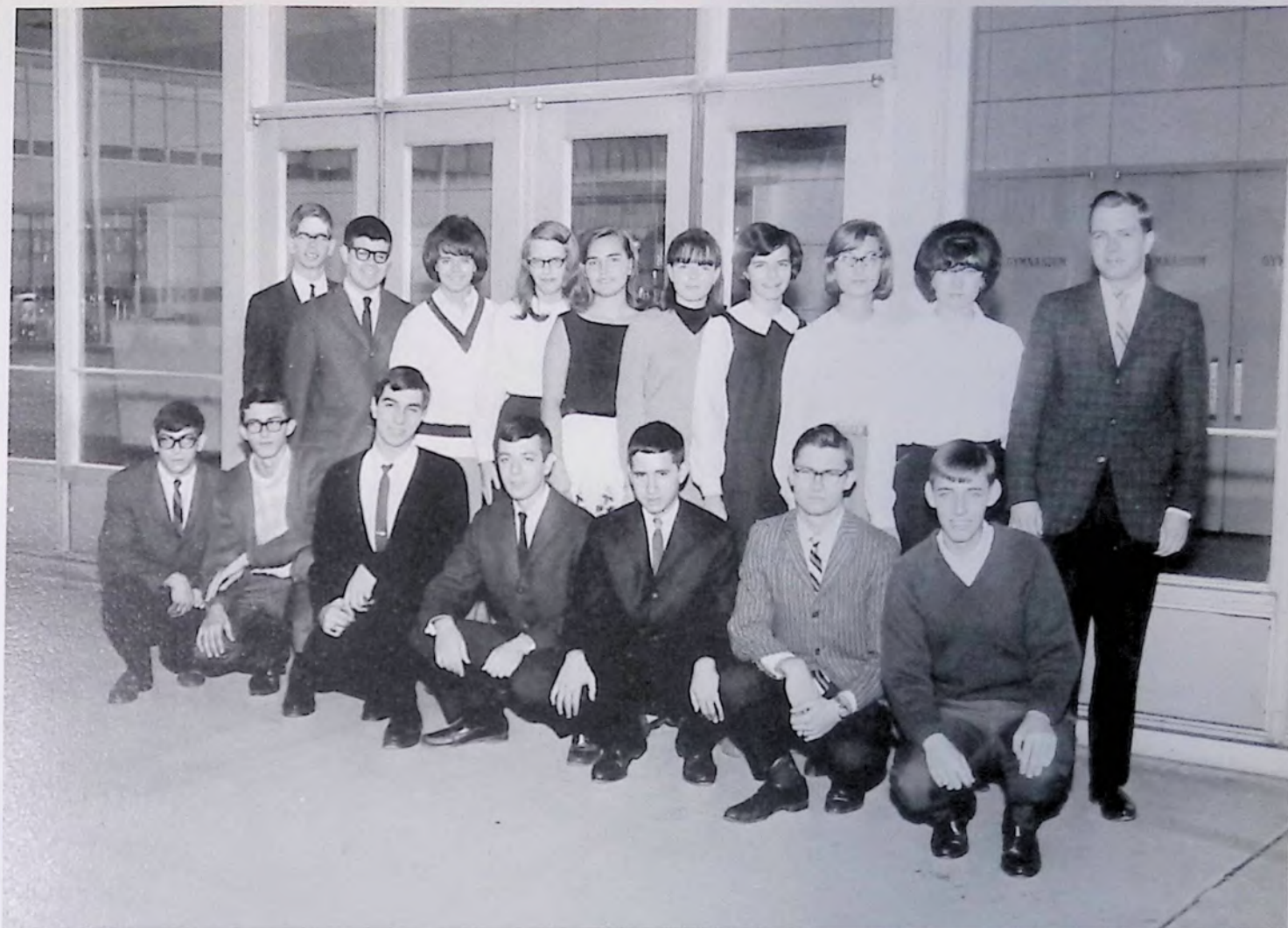
