The real rewards, though, were the performances. It was at these performances that our true talents came through. Danny — Cappo's solo in "Summer Poem" highlighted our evening concerts.



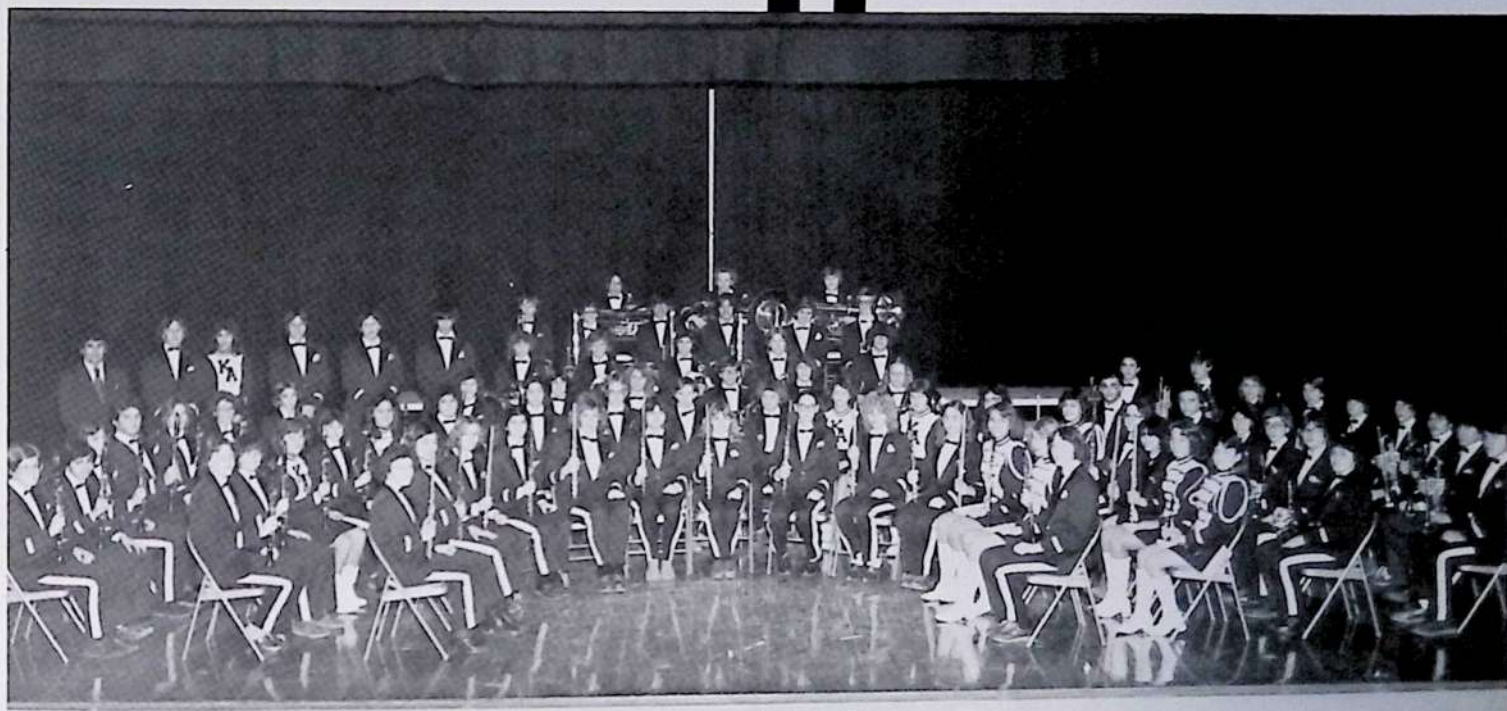

A group of students at Kiski have found the road to an educational experience in practical trades at the Northern Westmoreland Area Vocational Technical School. The Vo-tech school gives students a marketable skill which they can use right out of high school to find satisfying and well paying jobs. Before the school expanded in 1978, students could choose from any one of the following trades: Automotive Mechanics, Building Trades Maintenance, Carpentry, Commercial Art Drafting, Electrical Wiring, Food Services, Machine Tool Occupations, and Welding. Now, after the expansion, nine new fields have been added, they are: Air Conditioning, Refrigeration and heating Repair, Automotive Body Repair, Cosmetology, Distributive Education, Electronics, Graphic Arts, Health Assistant, Masonry and Materials handling.

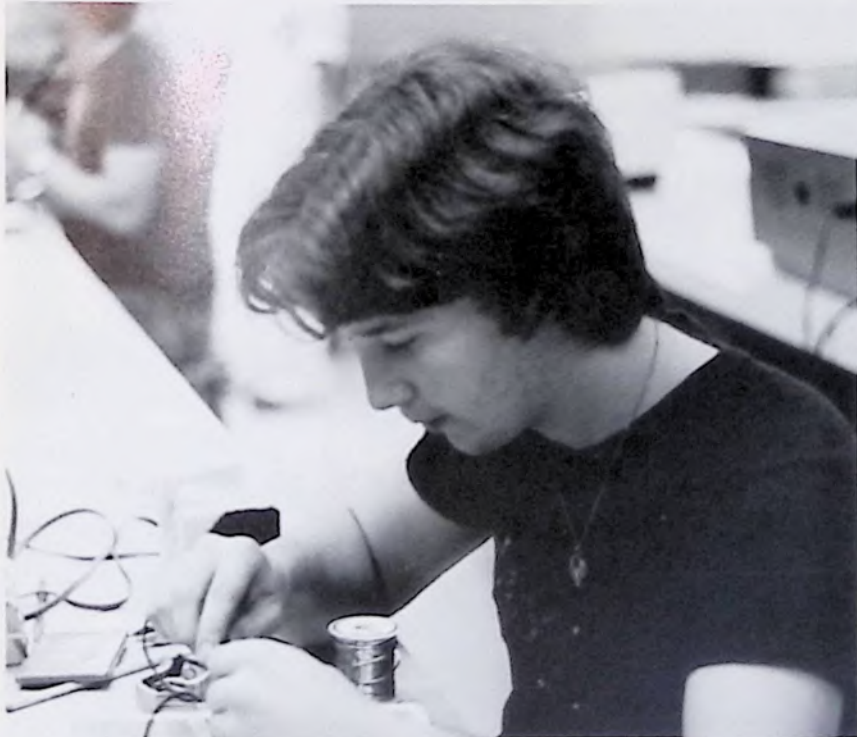

220 CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

The Kiski Area Children's Hospital Fund Drive was bigger and better than ever this year, raising \$50,000. Our total topped last year's total of \$45,000 and was the largest amount ever contributed by a single school district.
