
TORNADO

On Tuesday, June 3, 1980, at approximately 12 noon, a series of violent tornadoes ripped through the Kiski Valley causing damages in the millions of dollars. The tornadoes first touched down in Natrona Heights where a Fisher's Big Wheel Store was destroyed. After crossing the Allegheny River, the next area hit was the Melwood Manor section of Allegheny Township. One home was completely leveled, with many more sustaining heavy damage.

The tornadoes continued through Allegheny
Township doing heavy damage in the
Meadowbrook-Moreland Manor area. The next
object in the path of destruction was our own
Kiski Area High School. All of the damage at the
high school was confined to the Arts Building.
The roof was torn off in the area of the shops,
causing water damage throughout the building.
The entire roof and ceilings in the building had to
be replaced.

From the high school, the tornadoes made a path for Vandergrift, following the Serpentine Road into town. The Serpentine Road was closed for days as a result of the trees that were down. The hardest hit section of Vandergrift was Burns Street where at least four homes were completely leveled. Many other homes were damaged beyond repair. Trees and wires were down all over the heights. At least four garages were leveled between Emerson and Lowell Streets. From Vandergrift, the tornadoes crossed the Kiski River and hit North Apollo. From there they went over the hill and landed in the Edgewood Estates Trailer Court. Edgewood was the hardest hit area, with nearly all the mobile homes being damaged or destroyed. Miraculously, no one was killed during this "day of terror" in the Kiski Valley.




























James R. Daniels Superintendent

Beneath all the projects we are involved in, there lies one basic reason for the AV Club's existence—to make sure that the teachers receive audio-visual aids when and where they want them.
















Early morning practices were nothing unusual for them. Hour after hour was spent learning new routines and steps. The work seemed endless as they struggled to get it right.



Our year began back in the summer months right after the 1980-81 squad was chosen. Practices were held every day from nine to twelve during the summer.



Our host families were very hospitable and eager to make us comfortable and to help make the trip as beneficial and as successful as possible.



The student chairman of this first-time effort was Bruce Artman, assisted by Don Gibbon, Tom Ceraso, and Jim Wygonik.






















November 21, 1980, brought with it all the excitement and preparation associated with our annual Career Day.


Roughly 65 speakers respresenting some 52 fields or occupations were presented to the students as an opportunity for them to acquire understanding and insight into a possible career of their choice.



Three winners, a first, second, and third place, were selected from each grade level. The following pictures show the winning doors. The third prize sophomore door was torn down when our photographer got there.












The annual faculty Christmas tea was held this year on December 19 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.



There were other memorable times during the season. Playing an afternoon game on prom day was a thrill, but a heartbreaking loss to Deer Lakes (4·3) really hurt us.



A 4th place finish in the WCCA was the highest finish of the four invitationals the team competed in this year. In the WPIAL finals, Anthony Campisano placed 30th.


