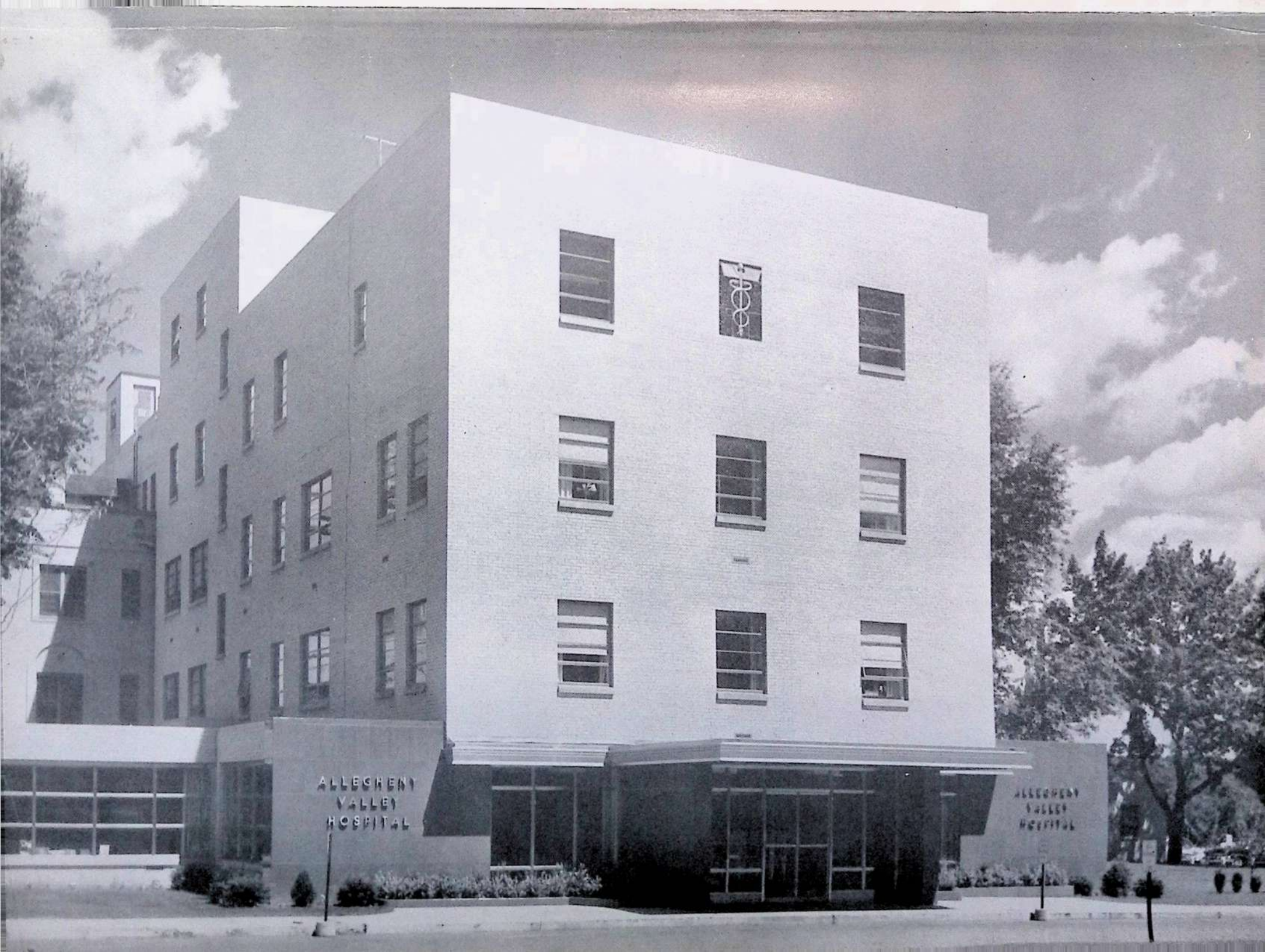

HEAD NURSES and SUPERVISORS

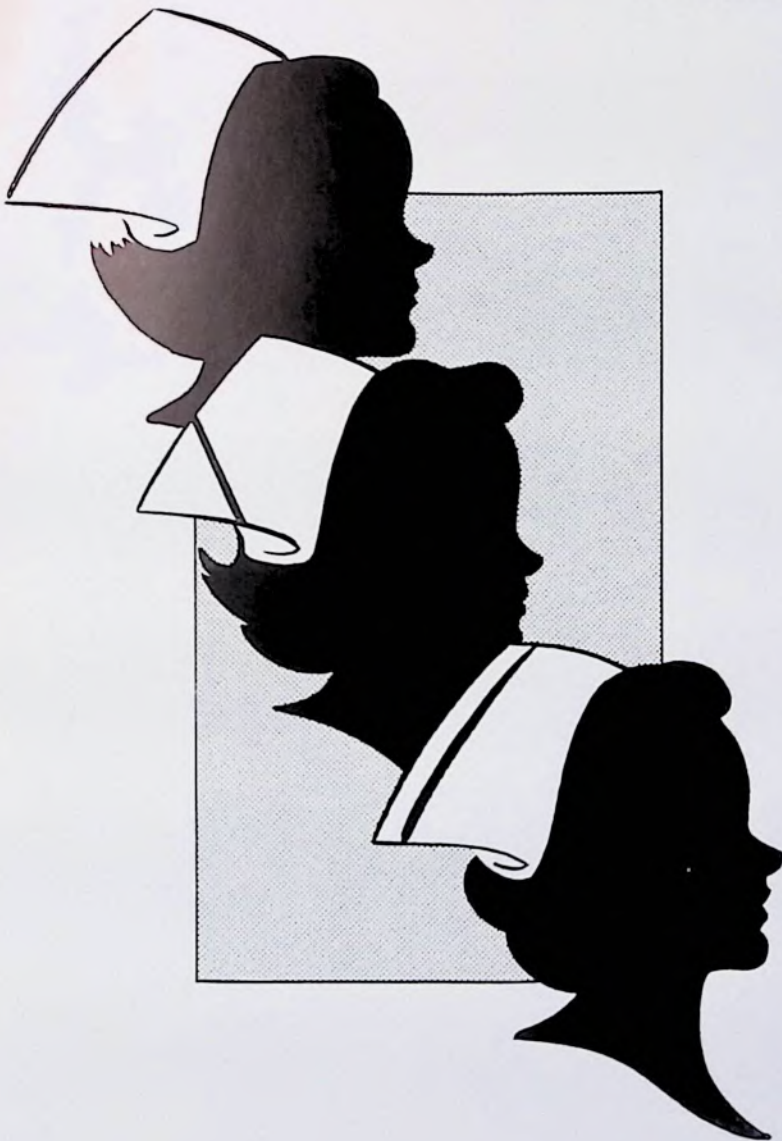
NURSING SCHOOL COMMITTEE

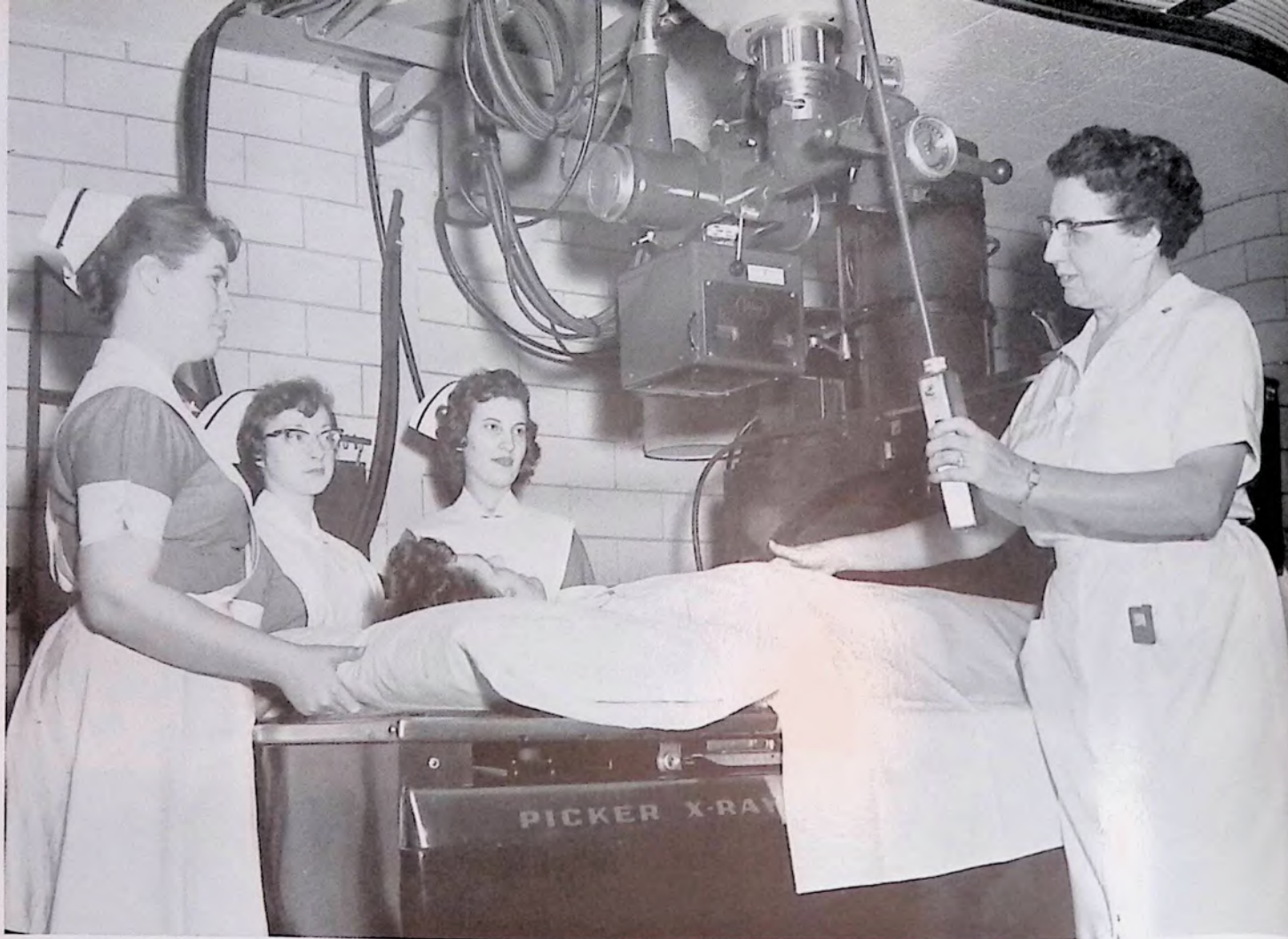
