# Class History

In June, the Alumnae Association honored us with a dinner-dance at the Country Club. Suddenly we realized that graduation was close, this giving us a tinge of sadness.

During the remaining four months we hurried up and reviewed all the things we had forgotten during the past few years in preparation for our graduate nurse days.
