
Class History



All of us were excited as we entered the large doors of the nurses' residence to begin our nursing education on the afternoon of September 13, 1961.

Can we ever forget the first few frustrating nights as a Freshman? Oh, how we counted the hours until the Fridays so that we could go home for a few days.





When we finally got down to work we found ourselves facing six Penn State courses and Fundamentals of Nursing. Mr. Goldenhar and his test tubes are "firsts" with us in Science.

After endless hours of study and numerous problems on the ward units we received our caps. "You could buy material and make your own but all the money in the world could not buy the true value of the nurse's cap."





Using sterile technique, we cautiously prepared our medication for our first I.M. Miss Sue Ann Coll, our clinical instructor, was always ready to help with the supervision.

Everyone anxiously awaited the day we would receive our junior stripes. A big surprise came when Mrs. Karrs presented them to us in study-hall. (September 13, 1962)





The operating room seemed like a new world to us. Gradually, as the days went by and we gained in knowledge and in experience, we also gained confidence in ourselves.

Coffee, tea or milk? This was the cheerful greeting of our kitchen personnel as they attempted to make our meals like those we have at home.





Since we had become juniors, we were granted more social privileges. During the summer months these were used to our best advantage. Old friends said good-bye as we went off to meet new ones on our affiliations. A whole new world unfolded before us as we gained a better understanding of mental illness in our thirteen weeks at Mayview.





Although we had been taking care of ill people for over a year, it seemed entirely different when the ill we were caring for were children. Joy, sadness, and sympathy were experienced by everyone at one time or another while at Children's Hospital.

"The glory is not in never failing but in rising every time we fail." Words of wisdom such as these were found inside our black bands which designated us as seniors. September 8, 1963.





One of our more enjoyable blocks of study was that of obstetrics. All of us were awed by the miracle of life—the birth of a baby.

During our program, much time was spent studying in the library. No matter what information we were seeking, Mrs. Kipp was always ready with a helping hand.





In the Emergency Room we assisted with everything from aces to braces and from clinics to casts. Did you ever think so much could go on in four small rooms? The White Cap Staff spent many hours quarreling, debating and then compromising. All strived towards one goal—to share our collection of memories with you.





The climax of the senior year was the May Dance which was held in our honor. Refreshments, music and dancing provided the atmosphere for an enjoyable evening.

Life is never so bad that it can't become worse. This became apparent as we learned of our future responsibilities during our experience as acting charge nurse.





Evenings of relaxation were pleasantly spent in the lounge. We critically viewed our favorite TV personages weekly, Ben Casey, Dr. Kildare and The Nurses.
