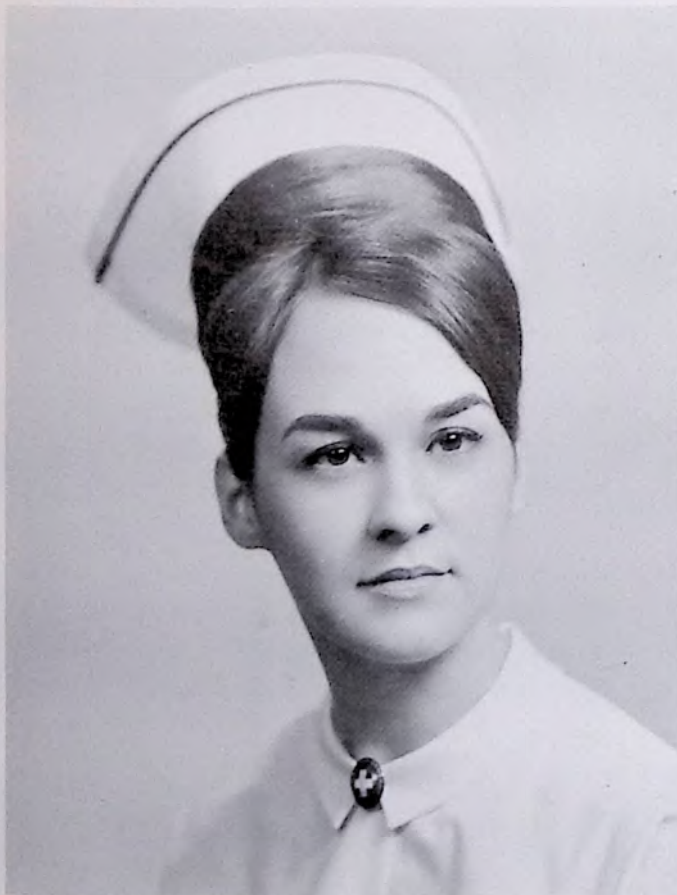
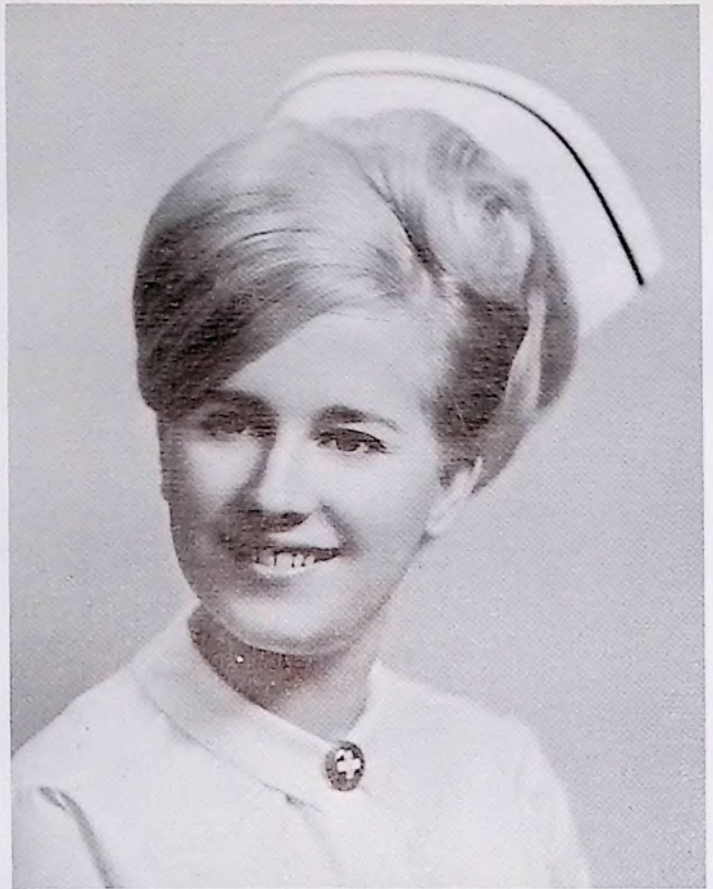

SALLY ANN MICHALIK

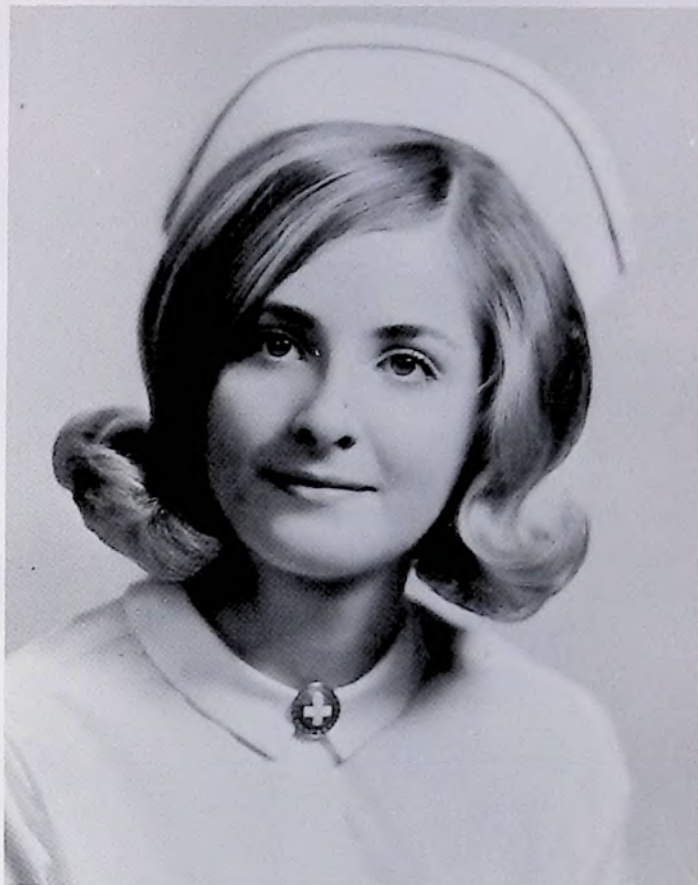

ETHEL VIRGINIA PETERSON

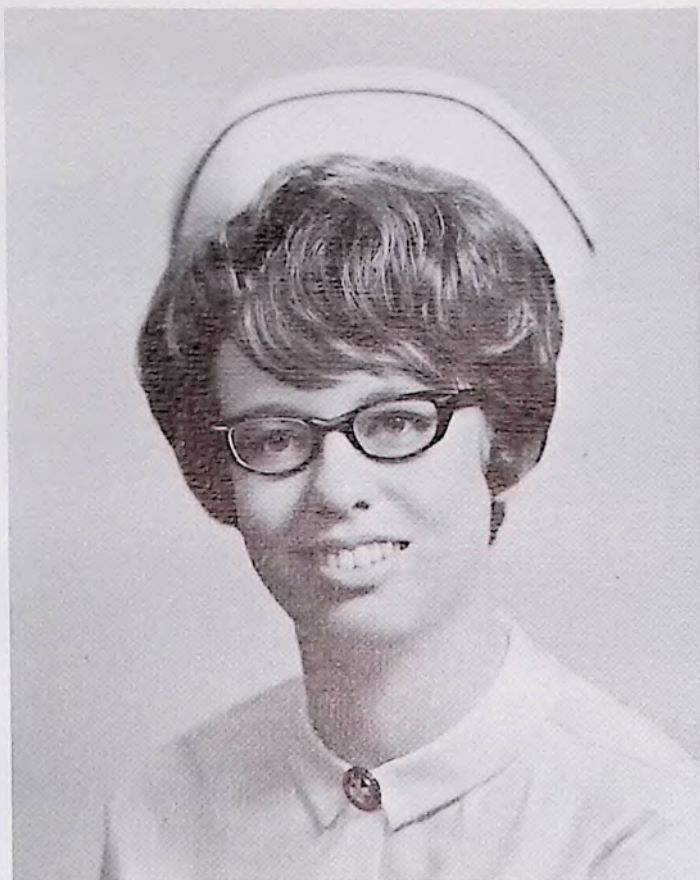

Hey Doc—about this order!

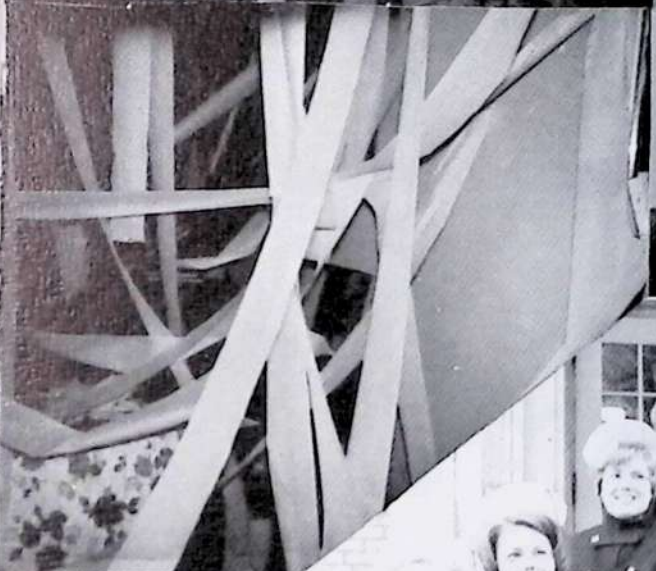

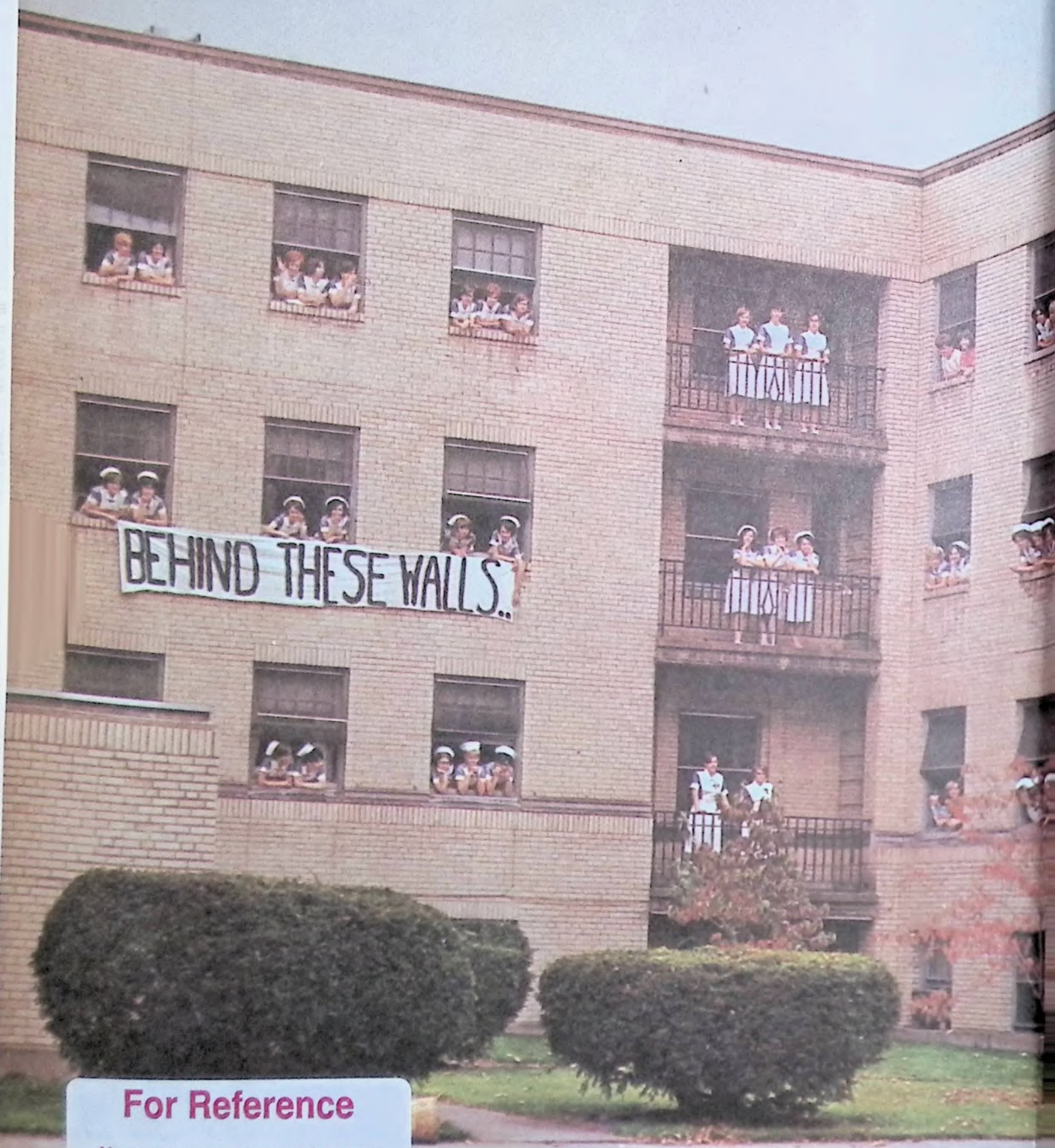
