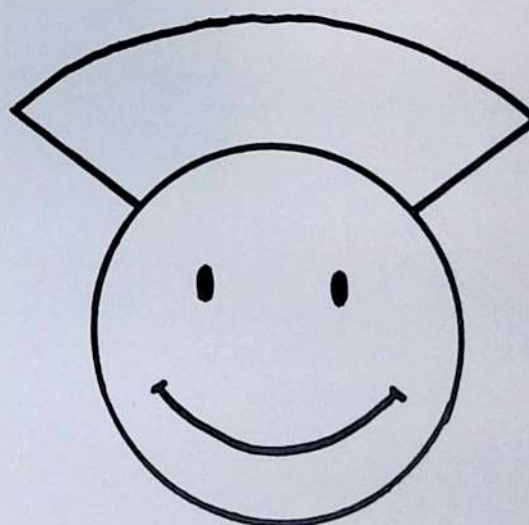

We the class of 1972 have chosen pictures of unknown people to symbolize the dedication of this yearbook—to all those who cared.

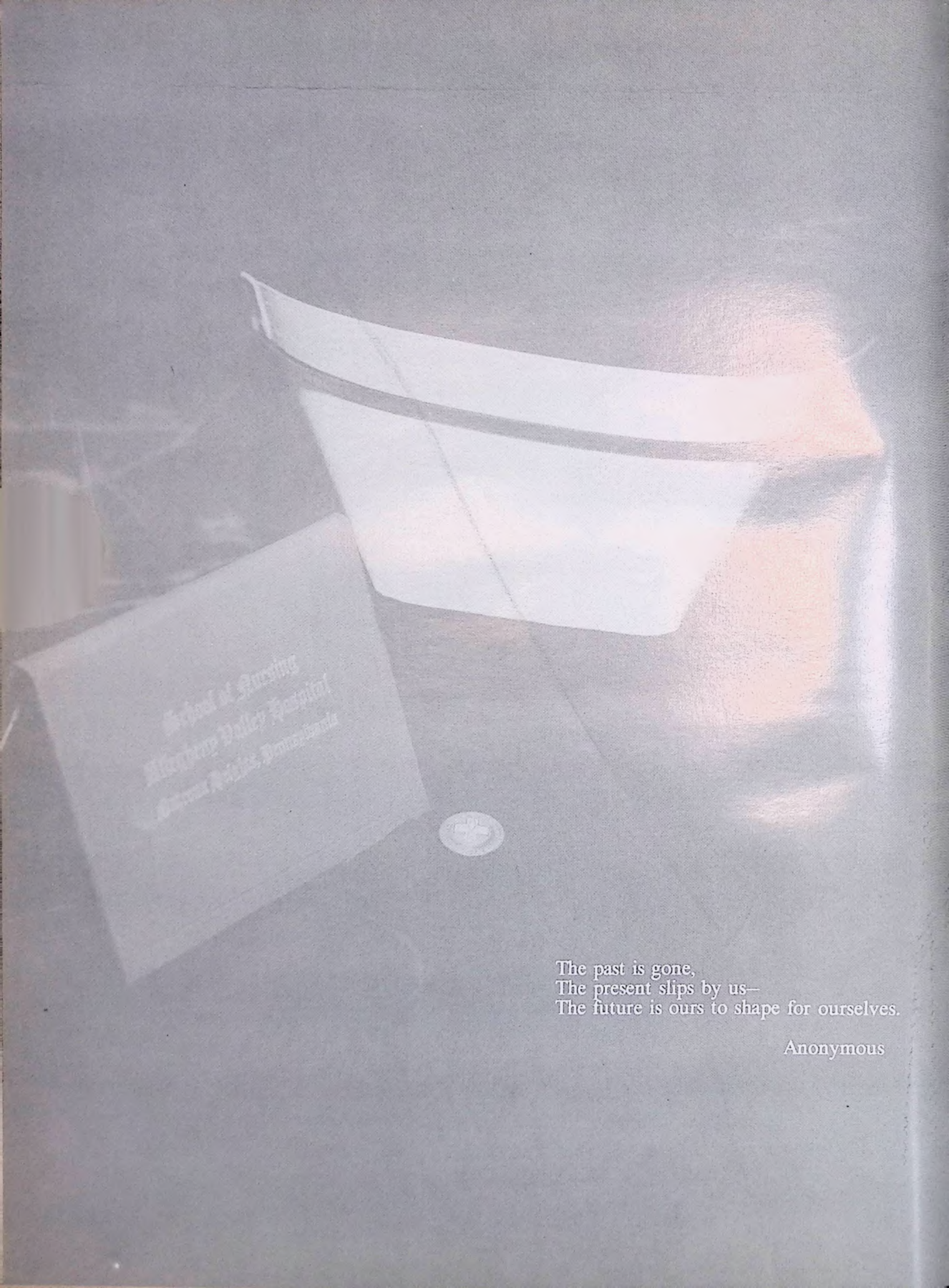

And just how much I love them.

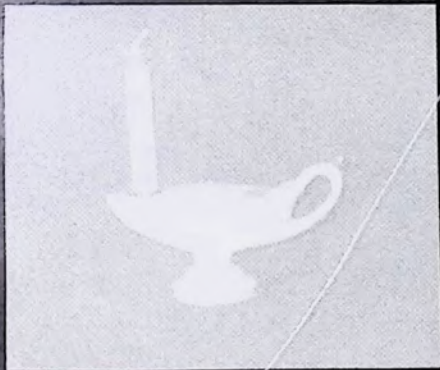
