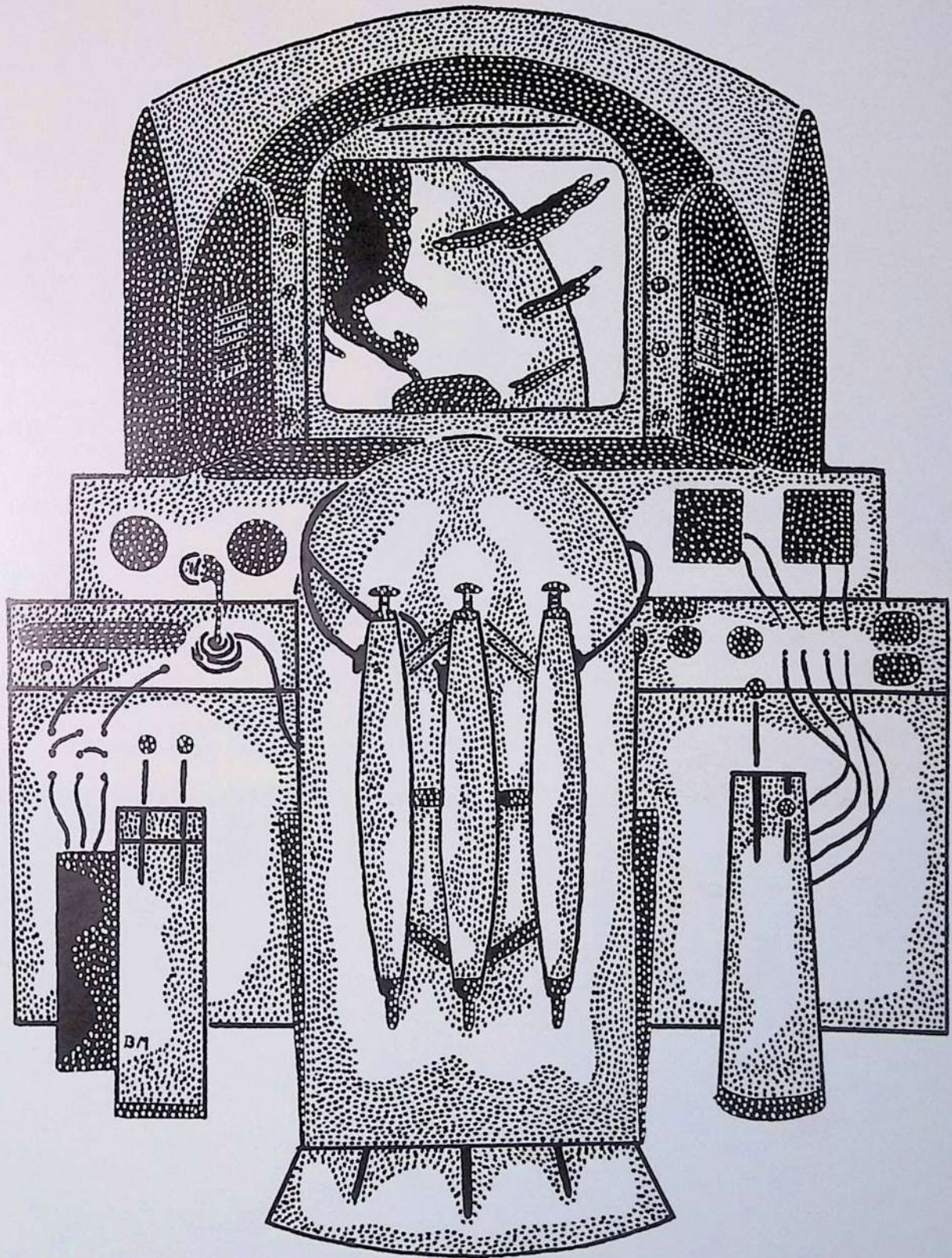
Foreword

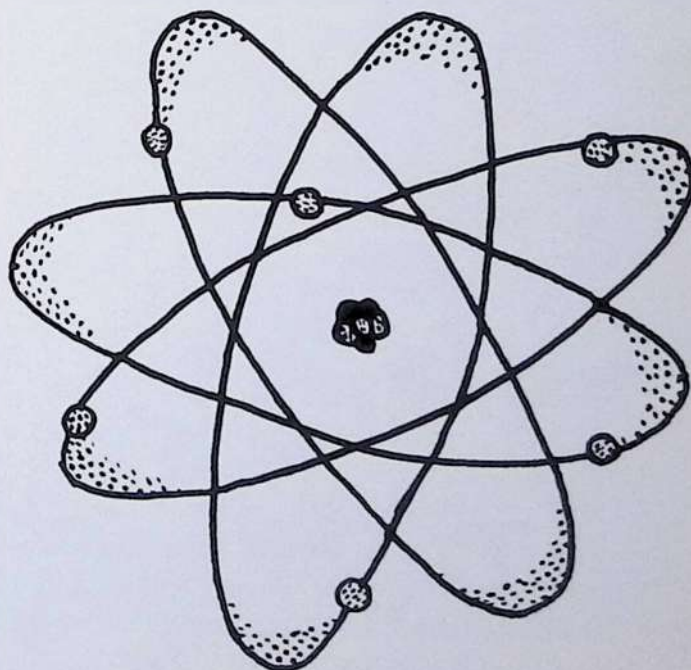

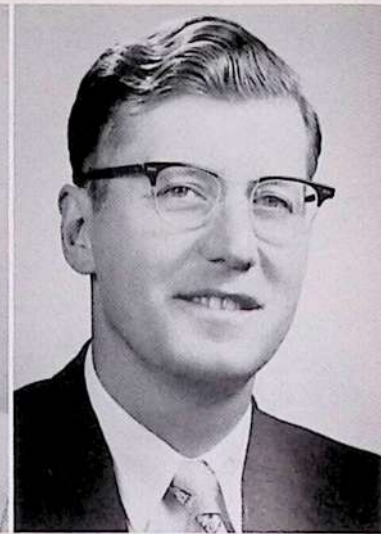

Library

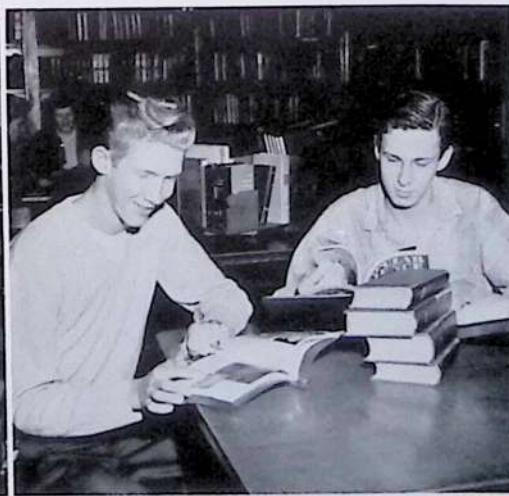
