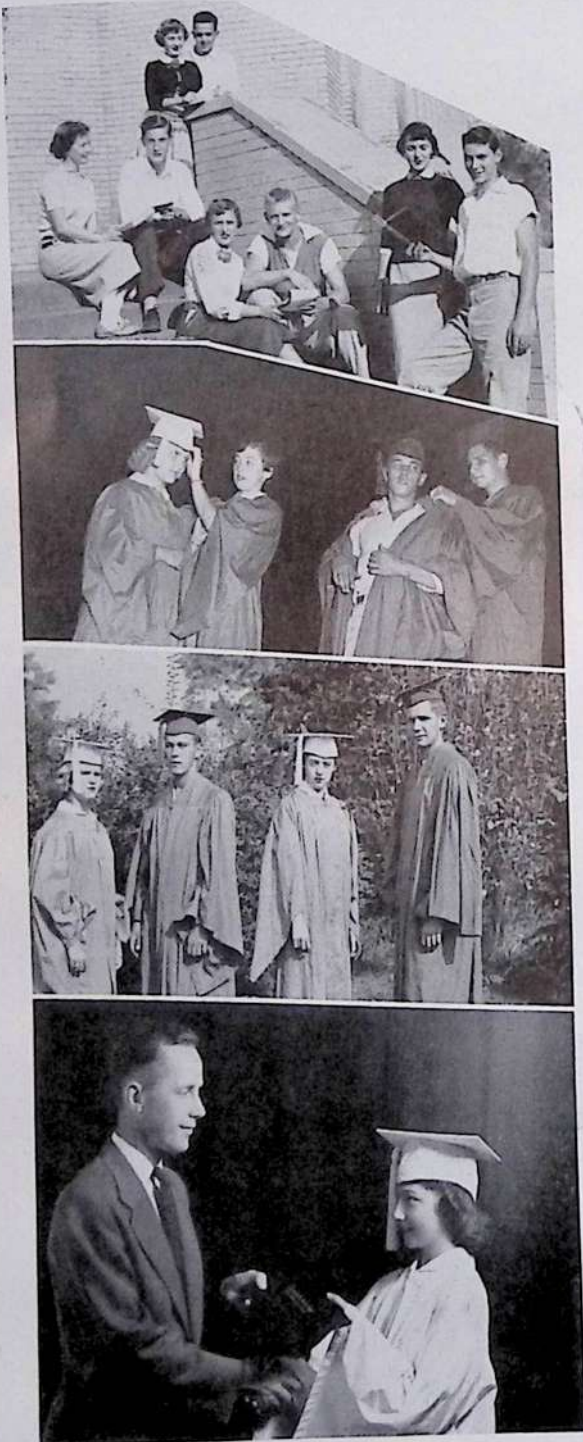


SENIORS

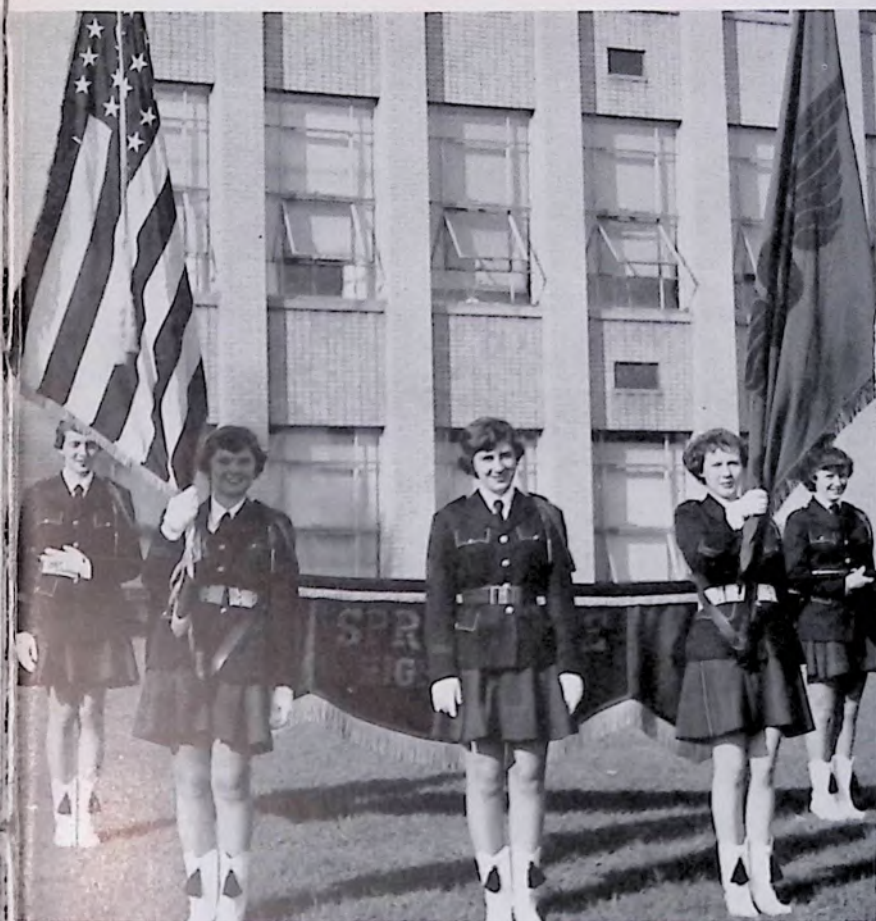

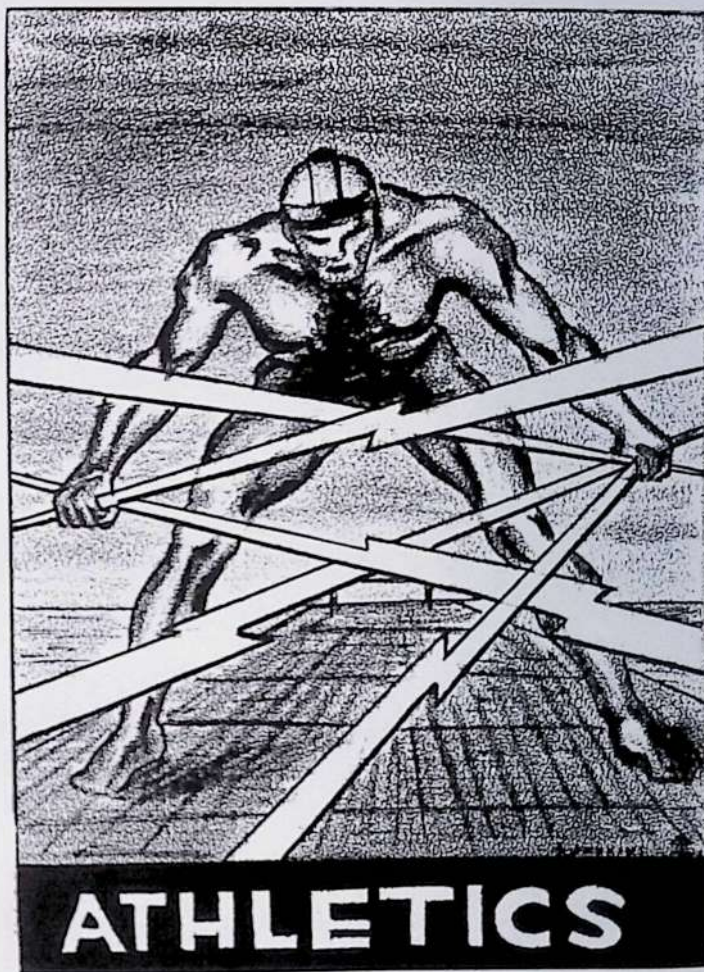

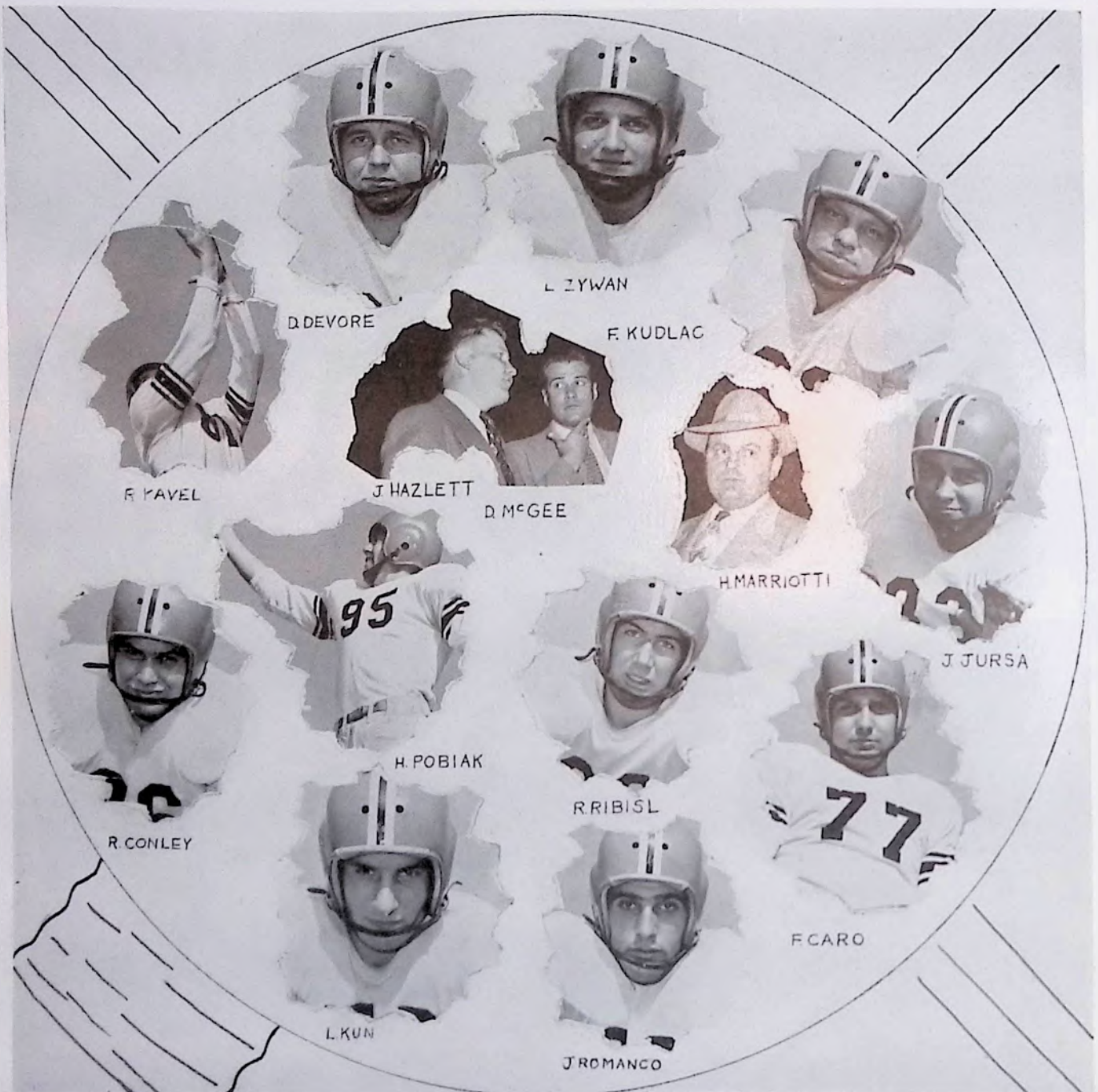
