The Valley win, triggered as much by the absence of 6-7 Bill Demharter from the Highlands lineup as it was by the Vikings' own ability, creates a stalemate for the Section 1-A lead that will be settled next week at an undetermined site.

Valley's Frank Tuschak, a 6-3 workhorse in the heavy going inderneath, allowed before the start of the game that something would be missing from his satisfied feeling if the Vikings won without having to contend with Demharter. Demharter's absence forced Highlands coach Chuck Gugino to completely revamp his offense - with stunningly unsuccessful results. "Yea, we had to switch around," he admitted afterward. "But we were so bad I don't think Rice (Valley coach Mike Rice) ever caught on anyway.'

Whatever changes Gugino's strategy alled for, one of them definitely was ot having Chada move away from the basket on offense, something the big enior did continually.

"Curiosity or challenge generally results in young people getting hooked

"SOME USE drugs simply as a means of revolting against adults and authority, little realizing that once started the availability of successful treatment to kick the habit is zero." said Miss Coffey.

She explained that she had spoken to drug pushers and they admitted readily that they never "introduce" young people to drugs.

Generally, the young experiment at the insistence of so-called friends. Once introduced, or hooked, the young people look for the pushers.

"I COULD BUY a new Cadillac any Monday from the profits I make each weekend. And, as long as there are fools willing to buy, I will sell," one known pusher told Miss Coffey.

Of course, it is up to the young to determine what they will become and how they will lead their lives. And right now they seem involved in the somewhat frightening experience of determining, "Who they are."

"THIS SEARCH has led to the use of narcotics and halluciandious drugs. Little do the young realize that the use of such things make them incapable of making their own worthwhile decisions and becoming the adults they so long to be," she said

Miss Coffey explained that although the use of drugs is illegal, a person caught in the company of one possessing drugs may also be considered guilty and subject to punishment.

"Do you think parents are responsible for youths taking drugs,' asked one student.

Miss Coffey was quick to reply that many would like to blame adults entirely but usually it is the young people's own curiosity, desire to experiment or need to be 'one of the crowd' that leads to addiction.

SHE ALSO answered other questions by noting a search warrant is needed to enter homes when officials are looking for drugs and that young people should not pattern themselves after irresponsible persons.

She advised them to carry the message of the harmful results to others as a means of widespread use of drug
