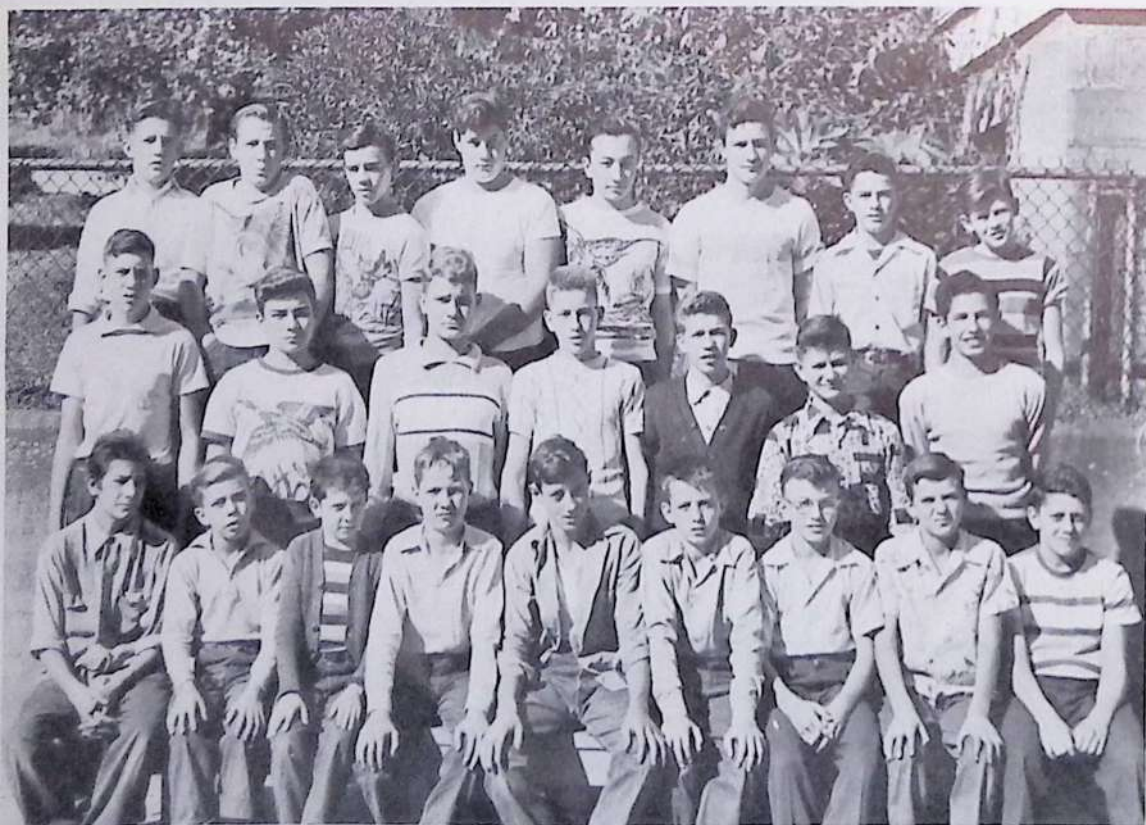
The purpose or aim of this club, is to provide more time for the boy to participate in gym activities for the promotion of health.

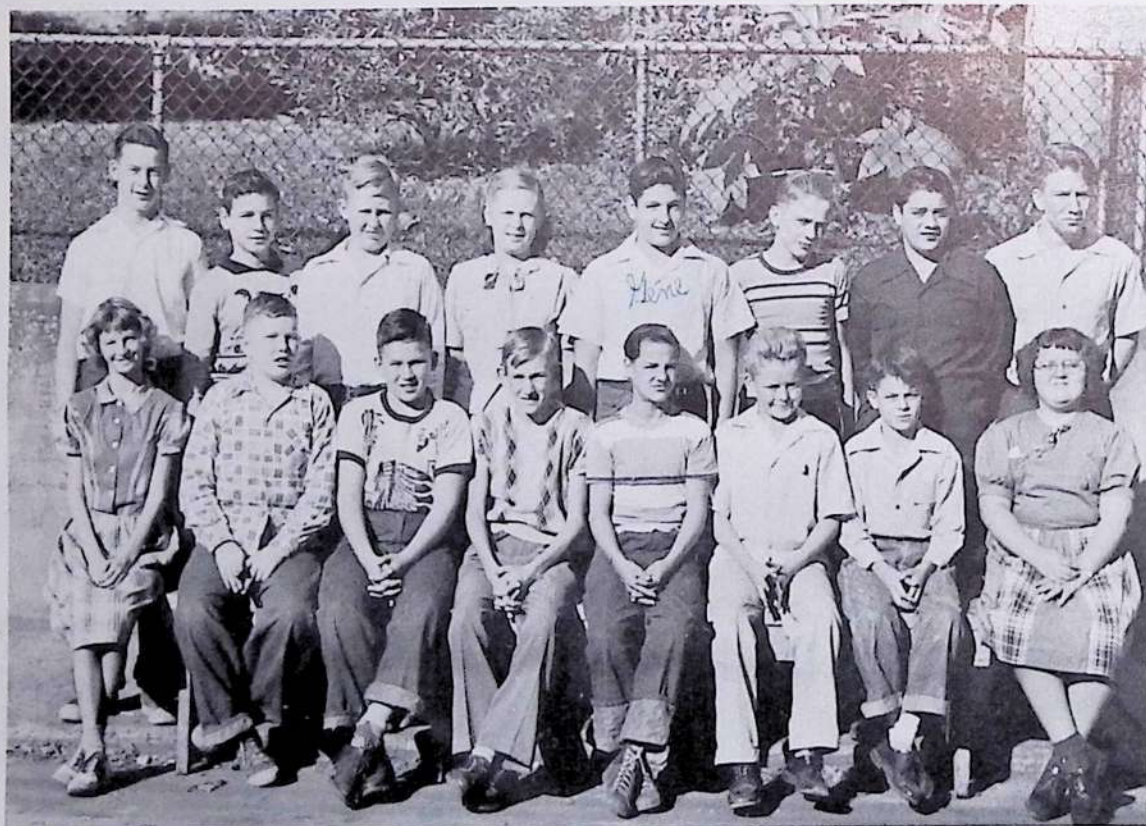
PICTURE CRAFT CLUB

SPORTS CLUB

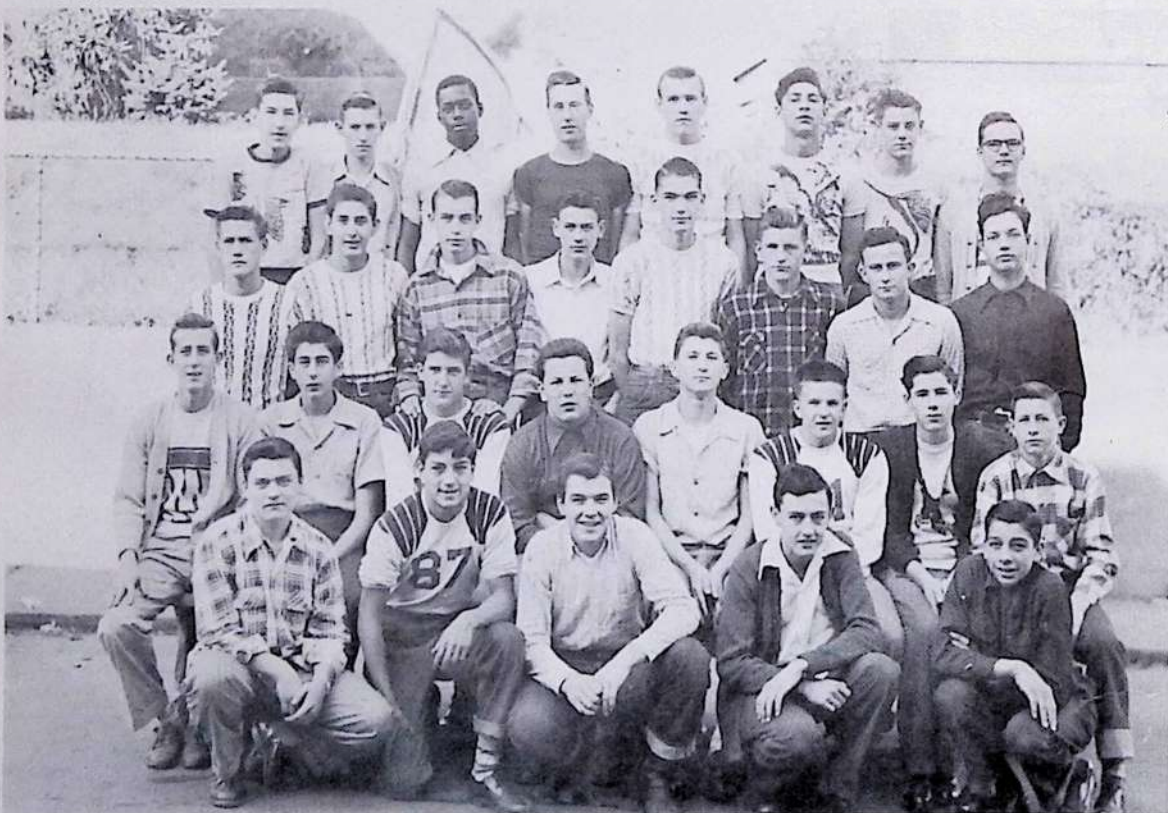
The Sports Club is a newly organized club which attracted to its membership many of the outstanding athletes of Edfra Senior High School as well as many athletic enthusiasts.
