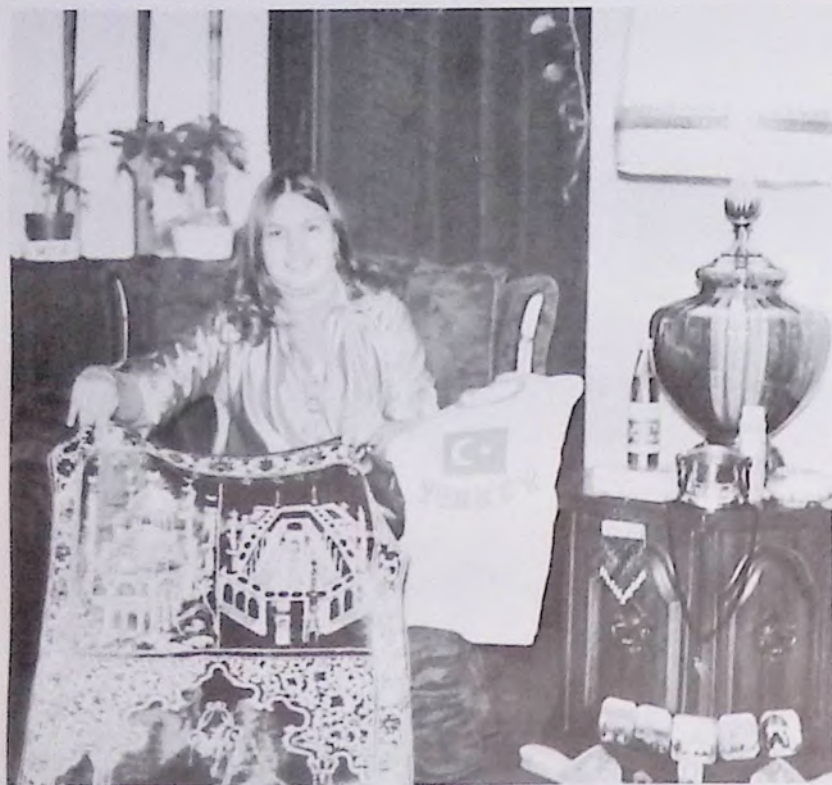


Girls Chorus

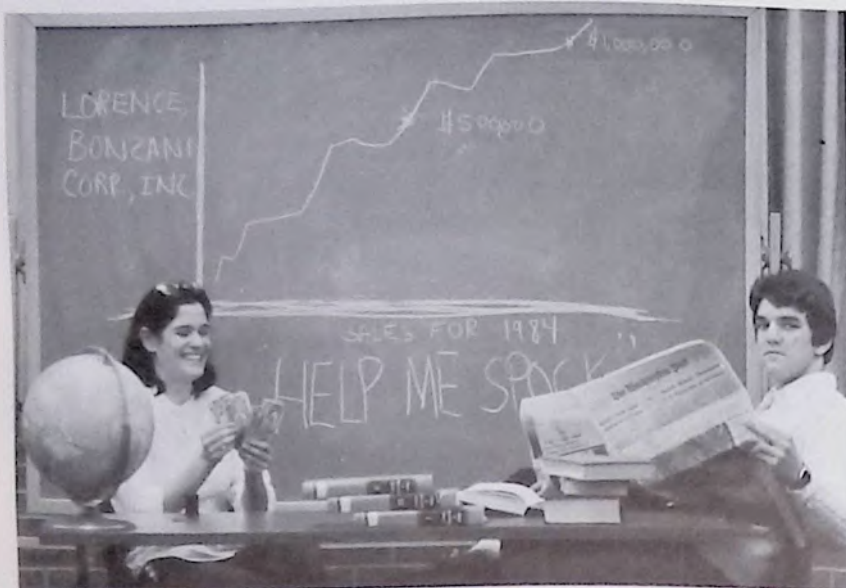

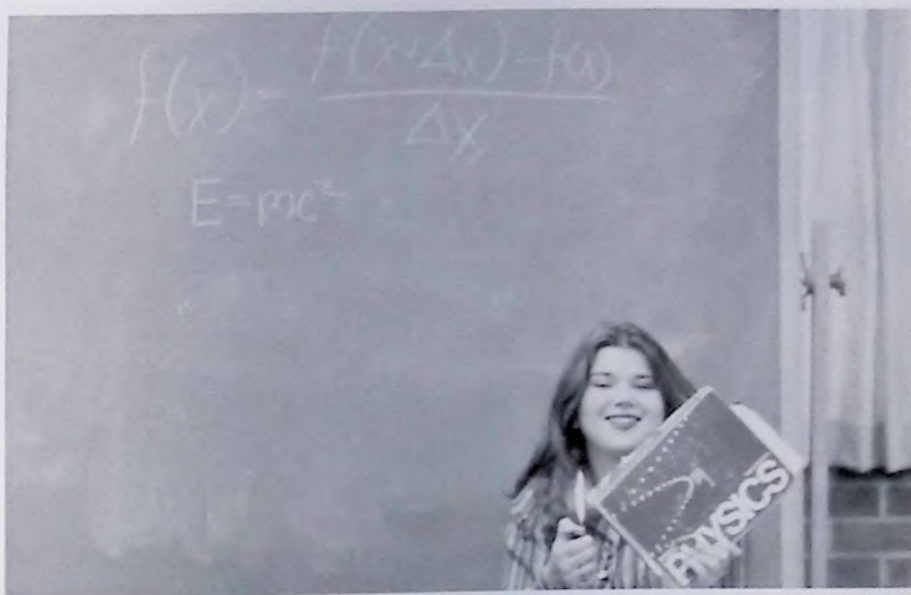

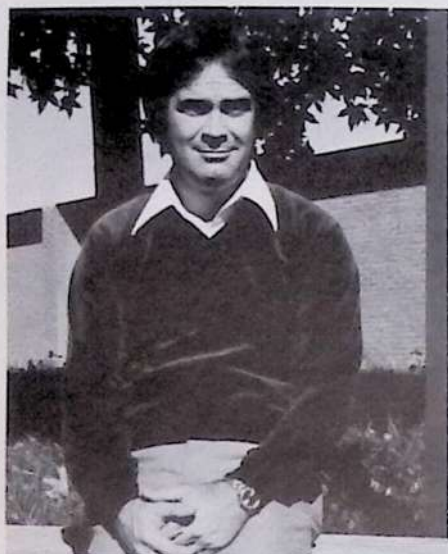
1980 WINTER OLYMPICS
