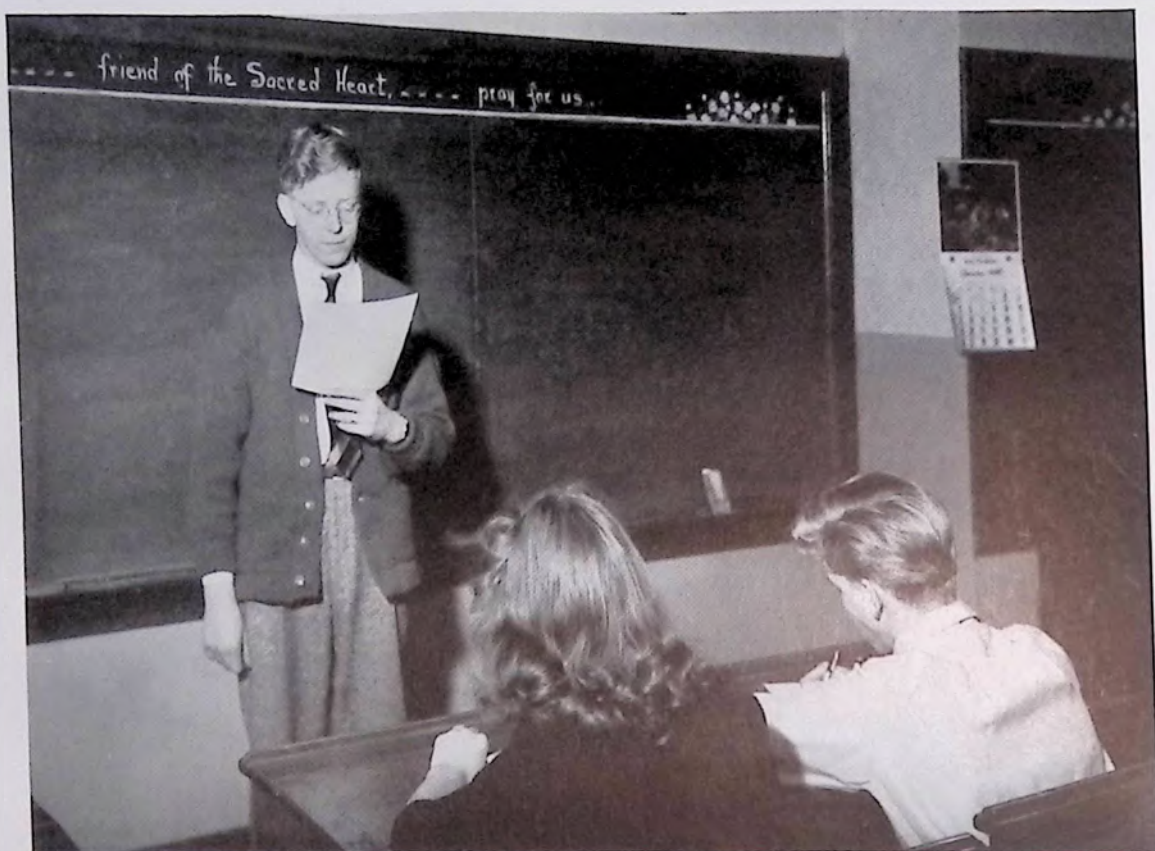

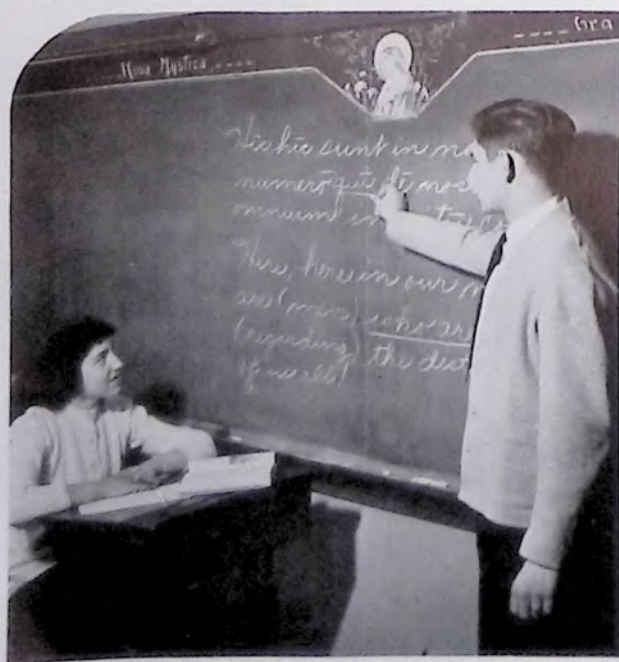

# Our Library

Small but mighty—that is our library. Its four walls are lined with books to please every taste. There are stories of saints, of brave and bold men, of warriors and great men of history, of science, of sports. Our biography is something of which we are quite proud. Our anthologies delight us according to our fancy.

Many new books have been added this year. I just finished "Inside Rome with the Germans" written by the American authoress, Jan Scrivener, and I enjoyed it very much. It is a very entertaining diary and has made a definite contribution to the history of World War II. From September 8, to June 4, 1944 the Germans occupied Rome and the story of what happened during that time is vivid and authentic. Carlton J. G. Hayes, our former ambassador to Spain, says in his foreword to this book: "How fortunate that among the very few Americans who remained in Rome throughout the war there was an alert and talented lady, who had a literary flair and kept a diary."

Then our sports fans go for such books as Joe DiMaggio's own story told in "Lucky to Be a Yankee."

"Mitri," the story of Prince Demetrius Augustine Gallitzin, by Daniel Sargent, is of interest to us who are not so many miles away from the place settled by Prince Gallitzin, and where he built his church, Loretto, Pennsylvania. Another charming book about the same Prince-priest is "The Prince Who Gave His Gold Away" by Sister Fides Glass, S.C.

You would enjoy "Adventurous Exile," a story of eight girls and their French teacher who go on a vacation to Brittany in the summer of 1939. The outbreak of World War II prevents their return to England. They live in a French convent, and they become very clever amateur spies and defeat the plans of the German officers stationed at the inn. You will find this an exciting, clever story.

"Whereon To Stand" by John Gillard Brunini has for its subtitle "What Catholics Believe

and Why." This book gives a clear explanation of our Faith to those earnest inquirers outside the fold who wish to have a general view. Not a line will be offensive to our non-Catholic friends.

I have not touched on our fiction, but to take only one book—"The Light of Stars" by Evelyn Wise shows us the heart of a truly great man. The life story of Father Gregory Lane shows us the wisdom of God and the dignity of man.

I was glad to see Father Harold Gardener's answer to the question "What is a good book?" He replied, "The job of literature is to enrich human lives. It must broaden in readers the virtues of faith, hope, and charity. The final and real test of a book that claims to be a work of literature is—Does it make richer my love of God and my fellowman?"
