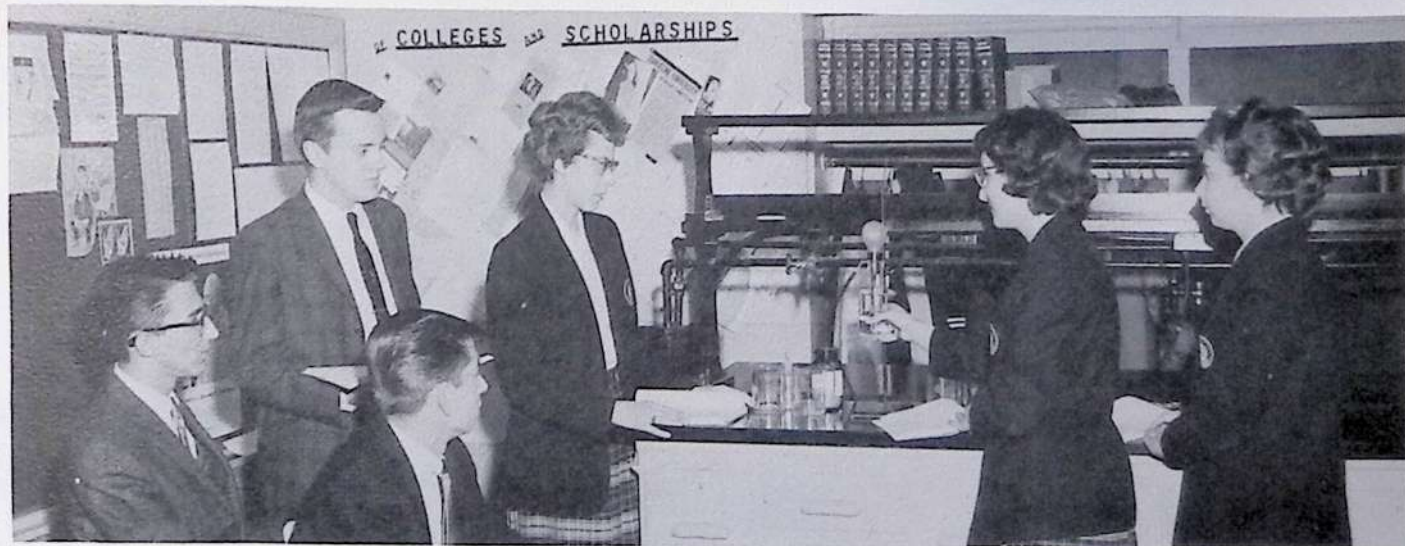

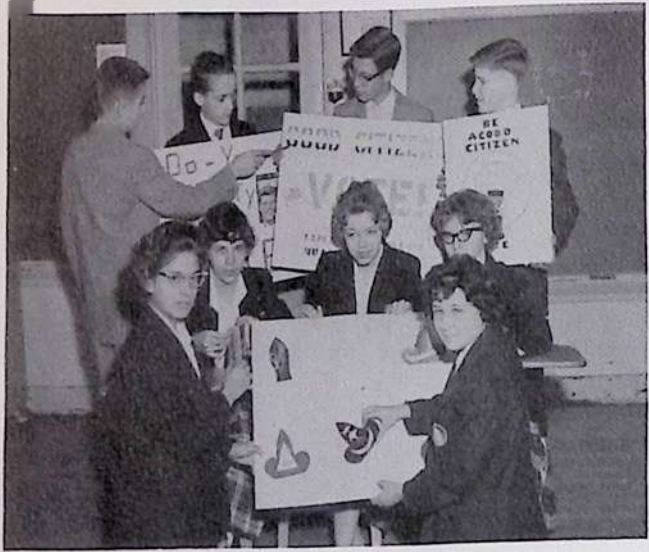

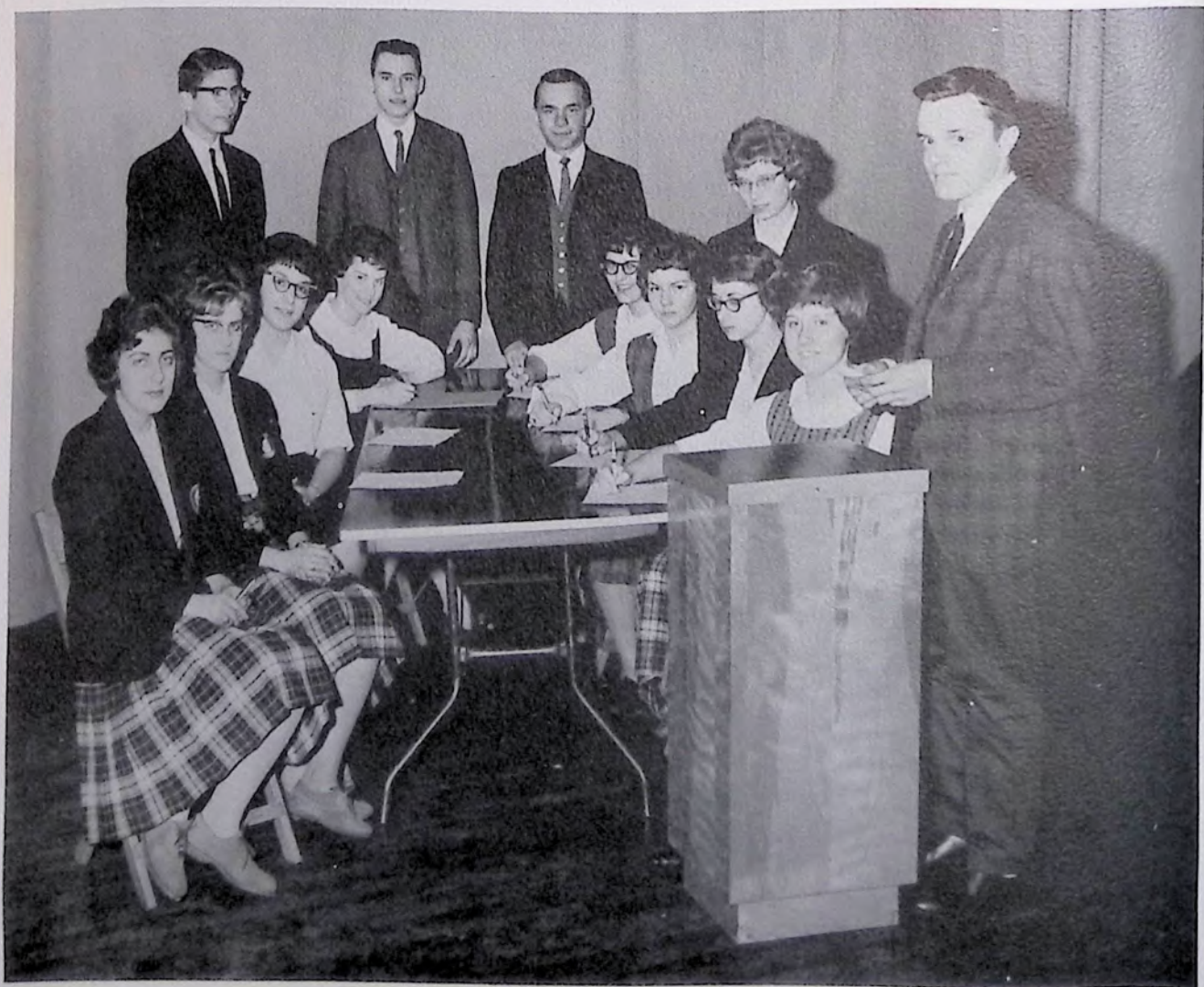

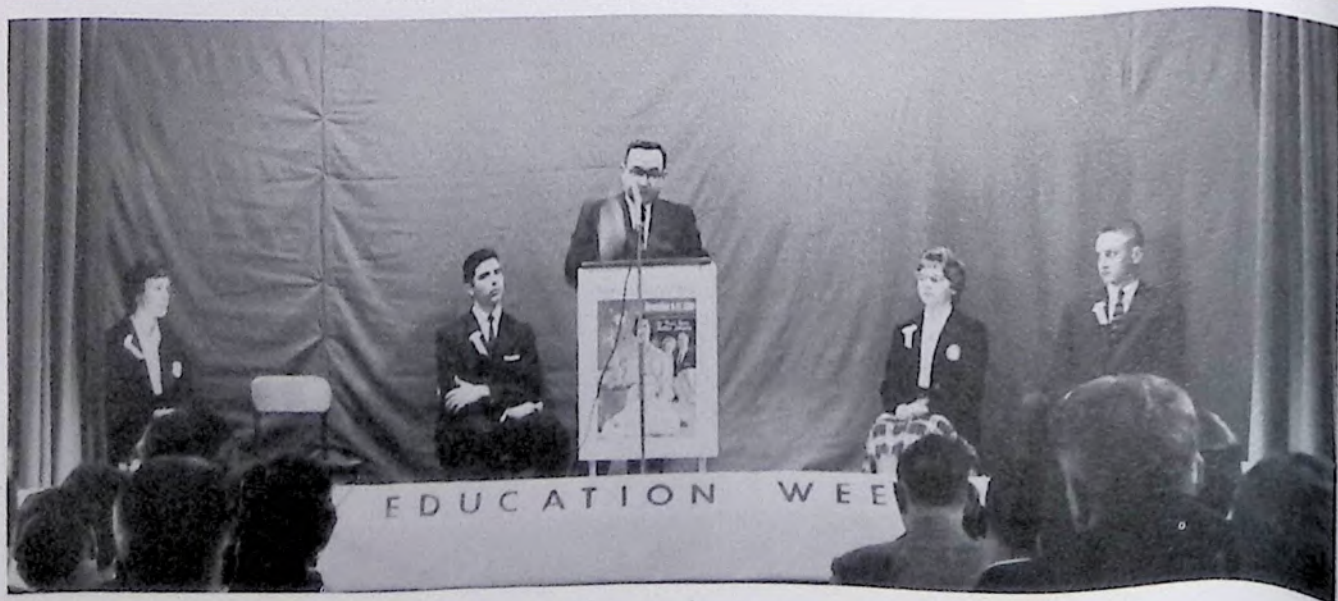

Coach Nee led the spirited Spartans through another year of hard playing and fine sportsmanship. A 12 wins and 10 losses record was a credit to our young team.



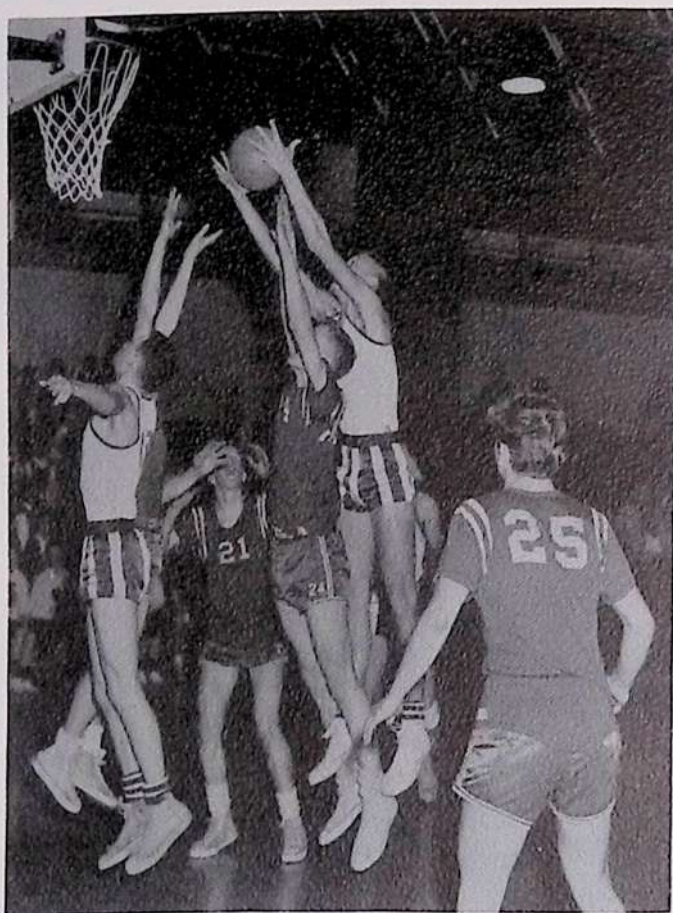
